## Article XXIV: Adverse Events Reporting

"Morbidity" and "Mortality" defined; Reporting Requirements.

- (1) As used in this rule:
  - (a) <u>"Morbidity" means an incident that results in mental or physical</u> <u>impairment which is related to or results from a dental procedure,</u> <u>administration of local anesthesia, oral conscious sedation, intravenous</u> <u>sedation, or general anesthesia.</u>
  - (b) <u>"Mortality: means an incident that results in a death related to a dental</u> procedure, administration of local anesthesia, oral conscious sedation, intravenous sedation, or general anesthesia.
- (2) <u>A dentist shall file a morbidity report with the board within 30 days after</u> the occurrence or such a time as the dentist becomes aware of or reasonably should have become aware of the incident. This includes the hospitalization of a dental patient, as a possible consequence of receiving dental services from the reporting dentist. Hospitalization shall be defined as an examination at a hospital or emergency medical facility that results in an in-patient admission for the purpose of treatment or monitoring.
- (3) A dentist shall file a mortality report with the board within 5 days after the occurrence of a death, or such time as the dentist becomes aware or reasonably should have become aware of the death.
- (4) <u>A dentist who fails to file a report as required by this rule and the board is</u> in violation or Article XXIV of the Rules and Regulations and is subject to all penalties and fines associated with this violation.



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
