Part 530. Arkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver Program

<u>Codification Notes.</u> This part as promulgated prior to codification into the Code of Arkansas Rules of 2024 provided as follows:

<u>"Summary.</u> This rule implements Act 471 of the 91st General Assembly, Act 535 of the 92nd General Assembly, and Acts 76 and 133 of the 93rd General Assembly, and Act 275 of the 94th General Assembly; establishes rules for the eligibility of <u>Guardsmensoldiers and airmen</u>; defines the purpose of the Arkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver Program; defines necessary responsibilities of the program; and sets forth entitlement criteria.

Applicability. This rule applies to all active members of the Arkansas Army and Air National Guard as defined in Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 60, Subchapter 2.

General. In this regulation rule, the words "Guardsman soldier" or "soldiers" and "Guardsmen airman" or "airmen" are intended to include both masculine and feminine gender unless specifically stated otherwise.

Distribution. This publication is available for both Arkansas Army and Air National Guard, Arkansas Division of Higher Education, all in-state accredited institutions of higher education, and the general public."

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Subpart 1. Generally

Chapter 1 General

1-1. 6 CAR § 530-101. Purpose.

This <u>rule part</u> establishes policy, procedure, and eligibility requirements for administration of the Arkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver Program (NGTW).

1-2. 6 CAR § 530-103. Entitlements.

(a) The NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver, as established by Acts 2017, No. 471, as amended by Acts 2019, No. 535, of the 92nd General Assembly and Acts 2021, Nos. 76, and 133, of the 93rd General Assembly and Acts 2023, No. 275, located in Arkansas Code § 6--60--214, allows all eligible

Guardsmen soldiers and airmen (see Chapter 26 CAR § 530-201 et seq.) to attend a state-supported
institution of higher education tuition-free.
(b) This benefit will waive tuition for a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) semester credit
hours.
(c) The NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver can only be used to obtain an
undergraduate degree, up to a bachelor's, and cannot be used by Guardsmensoldiers and airmen who
have previously been awarded a bachelor's degree.
(d) The cost of a Guardsman soldier's or airman's mandatory fees charged by an institution of
higher education that the soldier or airman is attending may be paid for with available funds allocated
by the Division of Higher -Education for the tuition-free program.
(e) Payment of mandatory fees, if any, will not exceed actual cost of mandatory fees.

In an effort to improve necessary strength and readiness levels in the Arkansas National Guard,
the NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver is:

and airmen; and
(2) is based Based on eligibility criteria detailed in Act 471Acts 2017, No. 471, as
amended by Act 535Acts 2019, No. 535, Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 60, Subchapter 2, this
regulation rule, and by the Arkansas Division of Higher Education (ADHE).

1-4. 6 CAR § 530-105. Responsibilities.
a. (a) ADHEThe Division of Higher Education is responsible for:
(1) Coordinating with the Arkansas National Guard regarding regulation rule changes or
modifications-:
(2) Administering receipt and disbursement of funds to the institutions and maintaining
fiscal records of the NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver-;
(3) Verifying the Guardsmansoldier or airman has submitted the Free Application for
Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)-and the Arkansas YOUniversal Financial Aid Application. Scholarship
Application Management System;
(4) Approving or denying YOUniversal Scholarship Application Management System
Financial Aid applications and submitting results to the:
(A) Arkansas Army National Guard Education Officeand Incentives Branch;
(B) the institution institution; and
(C) the Guardsman Soldier or airman-;
(5) Providing the Arkansas National Guard with eligibility verification for NGTWArkansas
National Guard Tuition Waiver criteria as outlined in Chapter 2 6 CAR § 530-201 et seq. of this
regulation.;
(6) Defining "mandatory fees-"; and

(7) Determining the amount of funds available and the allocation method to pay
mandatory fees.
b. (b) The Institution of Higher Education institution of higher education is responsible for:
(1) The Institution's institution's NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver

(B) the Education Services Officer (ESO); and
(C) ADHEDivision-;
(2) Verifying the Guardsmansoldier or airman is considered by the institution to be in
"Good Standing" "good standing" and meeting the requirements of Satisfactory Academic Progress
satisfactory academic progress (SAP) as defined in the institution's policies-;
(3) Verifying the Guardsmansoldier or airman:
(A) is enrolled in a program of study that leads to an undergraduate degree;

(B) does Does not already possess a bachelor's degree;
(4) Verifying the Guardsmansoldier or airman has applied for institutional grants and
scholarships applicable to the Guardsman soldier's or airman's term and major-;
(5) Notifying ADHE the division of the application close date and applicable term for
institutional grants and scholarships-;
(6) Notifying ADHEthe division of the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's current date of
acceptance as a student at the institution-;
(7) Notifying ADHEthe division regarding the status of eligibility and application
verification-;
(8) Providing to ADHEthe division a roster of all hours and dollars attributed to this
program as well as student completion status at the conclusion of each semester-;
(9) Informing ADHE-the division if the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's academic status
changes -; and
(10) Applying the NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver to student accounts
IAW in accordance with the sequence(s) sequence or sequences established in this regulation part.

c. (c) The Adjutant General (TAG) is responsible for:
(1) Coordinating with the ADHE division in promulgating rules for the implementation o
the NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver, including without limitation rules for the eligibility of
Guardsmensoldiers and airmen-; and
(2)(A) Making final decision regarding recoupment of all benefits paid on the
Guardsmansoldier's or airman's behalf for reasons including, but not limited to:
(i) absence Absence without leave (AWOL),;
(ii) substance Substance abuse violations; or
(iii) any Any other serious misconduct.
(B) (see See Paragraph 3 66 CAR § 530-306).
d. (d) The Arkansas Army National Guard-Education Office and Incentives Branch is responsible
for:
(1) Monitoring and verifying eligibility status of participating Guardsmensoldiers for the
Arkansas Army National Guard-;

(2) Receiving eligibility verification data from the Arkansas Air National Guard and
processing applications of participating Air Guardsmen airmen IAW-in accordance with this
regulationpart-;
(3) Maintaining records/database_records or databases or both and serving as point-of-
contact-point of contact for verification and discrepancies for institutions and ADH Ethe division-;
(4) Providing ADHE the division with a roster of all Guardsmensoldiers and airmen
requesting NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver for the term-;
(5) Reviewing eligibility verification rosters from ADHE the division and providing ADHE
the division with final NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver eligibility determinations-;
(6) Providing notification of NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver ineligibility
and ETPexception to policy request procedures to disqualified applicants-;
(7) Providing notification of ETPexception to policy request determination to ADHE-the
division and the Guardsmansoldier or airman-; and
(8) Educating Guardsmensoldiers and airmen on the process established by ADHE-the
division regarding mandatory fees.
e. (e) The Arkansas Army National Guard Education Services Officer (ESO) is responsible for:
(1) Serving as TAG'sthe Adjutant General's delegated proponent for the NGTWArkansas
National Guard Tuition Waiver;
(2) Coordinating policy changes with the ADHEdivision-;
(3) Coordinating with ADHEthe division, the institution, and the Guardsmansoldier or
airman to resolve any Exception to Policy (ETP) exception to policy-requests or grievances-;
(4) Processing ETPexception to policy requests in accordance with Chapter 3 of this
regulation 6 CAR § 530-301 et seq; and
(5) Rendering final approval or denial of any Guardsmansoldier's or airman's request for
an ETPexception to policy.
f. (f) The Arkansas Air National Guard Representative(s)representative or representatives is are
responsible for:
(1) Working directly with the Education Office Arkansas National Guard Education and
Incentives Branch and ESO Education Services Officer in executing and administering NGTW Arkansas
National Guard Tuition Waiver for the Air National Guard-; and
(2) Maintaining records/database records or databases or both and serving as point-of-
contactpoint of contact for verification and discrepancies for institutions and ADHEthe division.
g. (g) The Guardsman soldier or airman is responsible for:
(1) Meeting and maintaining eligibility criteria (see Chapter 26 CAR § 530-201 et seq.)
and submitting an application (see Chapter 36 CAR § 530-301 et seq.) before the deadline date each
semester . ;
(2) Maintaining eligibility criteria established by the institution in which they are
enrolled, the Arkansas National Guard, and ADHEthe division, and otherwise successfully completeing
the semester and all hours for which the tuition waiver is awarded-;
(3) Remaining in "Good Standing" "good standing" with the institution in which they
attend, as defined by that institution-;
(4) Achieving and maintaining "Satisfactory Academic Progresssatisfactory academic
progress" within their degree program, as defined by that institution-; and

(5)(A) If denied for the NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver, the
Guardsman soldier or airman may request an ETPexception to policy through the ESO Education Services
Officer if they feel they have extenuating circumstances which that were beyond their control or
unavoidable.
(B) The ETPexception to policy must be:
(i) <u>requested Requested</u> within thirty (30) calendar days of denial; and
(ii) processed Processed in accordance with Chapter 3 of this
regulation 6 CAR § 530-301 et seq.

Chapter 2Subpart 2. Eligibility
2-1. 6 CAR § 530-201. Eligibility Criteria criteria.
a. (a) The NGTWArkansas National Guard Tuition Waiver is available to all Guardsmensoldiers and
airmen:
(1) currently Currently serving in the Arkansas National Guard; and
(2) considered Considered at the time of application to meet all eligibility criteria.
b. (b) A Guardsman soldier or airman must be an Arkansas Resident resident or eligible for in-state
tuition under A.C.A. §6-60-205.
c. (c)(1) A Guardsman soldier or airman must have completed Initial Active Duty Training initial
active duty training (basic training or credit for a basic course through the Reserve Officers' Training
Corps-ROTC).
(2) Guardsmen Soldiers and airmen with an exigent circumstance that warrants a
temporary waiver of the Initial Active Duty Training requirement may request an Exception to Policy
exception to policy (ETP) IAW in accordance with paragraph 3-8 of this regulation 6 CAR § 530-308.
d. (d)(1) A Guardsman Soldier or airman must not currently hold a bachelor or higher degree.
(2) In the event a Guardsman possesses a credential or degree awarded from a foreign
entity, the Guardsman must first seek evaluation of the degree's equivalency at the Institution of Higher
Education.
(3) If the Institution of Higher Education determines, in accordance with its policies and
accreditation requirements, the foreign credential does not equate to a bachelor's degree or higher, the
Guardsman may use the National Guard Tuition Waiver in pursuit of a bachelor's degree
(4) If the Institution of Higher Education determines the foreign credential meets the
equivalency requirements of a bachelor's degree, however, the soldier or airman may not use the
National Guard Tuition Waiver.
e. (e)(1) A Guardsman soldier or airman must be accepted and enrolled in an undergraduate
degree producing degree-producing program at an Arkansas state-supported public institution of higher
education recognized by ADHE the Division of Higher Education.
(2) (see See Appendix A).
f. (f)(1) A Guardsman soldier or airman must have:
(A) completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

,and

- (B) the The Arkansas YOUniversal-Scholarship Application Management System

 Ffinancial Aaid Aapplication; and

 (B) applied Applied for grants and scholarships with the institution in which they are enrolled.

 (1) (2) Neither selection nor non-selection for receipt of institutional grants and scholarships shall disqualify a Guardsmansoldier or airman from receiving the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver.

 (2) (3)(A) In determining whether a Guardsmansoldier or airman has met the application deadline for institutional grants and scholarships, the application deadline date shall be compared to the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's date of admittance to the institution and the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's date of entry into the Arkansas National Guard.
 - (B) Institutional grants and scholarships with application periods closing prior to the latter of these dates shall not disqualify a Guardsman soldier or airman from receiving the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver.
 - (C) The soldier or airman must submit federal, state, and institutional financial aid applications in accordance with the timelines established for each of those programs.
 - g. (g) A GuardsmanSoldier or airman must be in "Good Standinggood standing" with their enrolled institution and meeting the requirements of Satisfactory Academic Progress"satisfactory academic progress" (SAP), as defined by that institution.
 - h. (h) GuardsmenSoldiers and airmen must remain in "Good Standing" "good standing" with the ARNGArkansas National Guard.

2-2. 6 CAR § 530-202. Arkansas Army National Guard Criteria criteria.

- a. (a) GuardsmenSoldiers -must be considered to be in "Good Standing good standing" at the time of application.
- b. (b) The Education Office Arkansas National Guard Education and Incentives Branch will verify eligibility criteria for all Army Guardsmensoldiers.
- c. (c) GuardsmenSoldiers currently under Suspension of Favorable Action suspension of favorable actions for, but not limited to, AWOLs absent without leave infractions, substance abuse violations, or any other serious misconduct at the time of application are not eligible for the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver.

2-3. 6 CAR § 530-203. Arkansas Air National Guard Criteria criteria.

- a. (a) Guardsmen Airmen must be considered to be in "Good Standing" "good standing" at the time of application.
- b. (b) The Air National Guard Representative will verify eligibility criteria for each Air Guardsman airman through their Unit Commander.
- (c) Guardsmen Airmen currently under Suspension of Favorable Action suspension of favorable actions for, but not limited to, AWOLs absent without leave infractions, substance abuse violations, or

any other serious misconduct at the time of application are not eligible for the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver.

2-4. Eligibility Determination & Processing

- a. (a) For each NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver applicant and term, ADHE-the Division of Higher Education will provide the status of ADHE-division and Educational Institution educational institution verified items in Table 2-1the table in subsection (d) of this section to the Education OfficeArkansas Army National Guard Education and Incentives Branch.
- b. (b) Upon receipt of Table 2–1 verification data from the table in subsection (d) of this section from ADHEthe division, the Education Office Arkansas National Guard-Education and Incentives Branch will verify service component criteria and provide an NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver eligibility determination to ADHE-the division and the Guardsman soldier or airman.
- Education Office's Arkansas National Guard-Education and Incentives Branch's notification to the Guardsmansoldier or airman.

Chapter 3Subpart 3. Administration

3-1. 6 CAR § 530-301. Application Processprocess.

- a. (a)(1) Guardsmen Soldiers and airmen requesting NGTW-the National Guard Tuition Waiver will obtain the application and Statement of Understanding (SOU)statement of understanding-through the Arkansas Army National Guard Education and Incentives Branch website.
- (2) All applications and SOUs-statements of understanding must include the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's signature (digital or manual). Script fonts or other typed signatures are not authorized.
- b. (b) Applications for Army Guardsmensoldiers will be routed to the Education Office Arkansas National Guard-Education and Incentives Branch for verification of eligibility as listed in Paragraphs 2-2 and 2-4 above 6 CAR §§ 530-202 and 530-204.
- c. (c) Applications for Air Guardsmenairmen will be routed to the Air National Guard Representative representative for verification of eligibility as listed in Paragraph 2-3 and 2-4 above 6 CAR §§ 530-203 and 530-204 before processing at the Education Office Arkansas National Guard Education and Incentives Branch.
- d. (d) Once verified and approved, applications are submitted to the ADHE-Division of Higher Education for disbursement of funds to the institutions of higher learning.

3-2. 6 CAR § 530-302. Submission Deadlines deadlines.

- a. (a) Applications must be submitted for each semester in which the <u>Guardsman</u>soldier or airman wishes to receive the <u>NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver</u>.
- b. (b) The NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver may be applied for all semester and intersession courses.
- c. (c) Applications may be submitted up to sixty (60) calendar days prior to the start of the course, but must be submitted NO LATER THAN no later than thirty (30) days after the start of the course.
- d. (d)(1) Applications received after the deadline date may not be awarded and therefore the Guardsman soldier or airman would be responsible for paying tuition to the institution.
- (2) An ETPexception to policy can be requested through the ESO Education Services Officer in writing.

Authority. Arkansas Code § 6-60-214.

3-3. 6 CAR § 530-303. Authorized Usesuses.

a. (a) The NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver will only be awarded for programs leading to an undergraduate degree.

- b. (b) Eligible Guardsman Guardsmensoldiers and airmen may use the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver until completion of a bachelor's degree or for a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) semester credit hours, whichever comes first.
- c. (c) The NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver will only cover tuition and, subject to the availability of funds, mandatory fees.
- (d) The Guardsman soldier or airman is responsible for all other costs, such as mandatory fees not covered by the NGTW waiver, additional fees, room and board, textbooks, etc and other expenses.
- d. (e) The NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver will not be applied to courses completed in a prior semester.
- e. (f) Guardsmen Soldiers and airmen enrolled in high school and college concurrently are not eligible for the tuition waiver.
- f. (g)(1) The NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver may be awarded to exclusively online degree programs where the degree-offering institution is associated with a state-supported institution of higher education.
- (2) The associated state-supported institution must be recognized by ADHE-the Division of Higher Education as an accredited public institution of higher learning.
- (h) The National Guard Tuition Waiver may be used concurrently at more than one institution, provided it is in pursuit of a single Bachelor's degree and both institutions are NGTW eligible.
- (1) Examples include prerequisite or core level courses at an eligible satellite or community college in addition to a primary campus.
- (2) In such cases, the Education and Incentives Branch may coordinate with the institution to confirm eligibility. Semester hour limits shall include all hours pursued using NGTW at each campus.

3-4. 6 CAR § 530-304. Continuation of Eligibility eligibility.

- a. (a)(1) In the event a mobilization or deployment interrupts the enrollment of a Guardsmansoldier or airman currently receiving the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver, the Guardsmansoldier or airman-will remain eligible for a period of time equal to the -semester in which they were enrolled.
- (2) It is the Guardsmansoldier's or airman's responsibility to notify the institution, via copies of orders, of mobilization or deployment.
- b. (b) In the event of a non-medical nonmedical discharge or a medical discharge that is not caused by an illness or injury related to the performance of duties for the Arkansas National Guard, the Guardsmansoldier or airman is eligible to receive the NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver for the semester in which they are enrolled at the date of discharge.
- (c) In the event of a medical discharge or medical retirement as a result of illness or injury incurred in the line of duty, as the result of a state or federal activation or a terrorist action as determined by the Governor, the <u>Guardsmansoldier or airman</u> is eligible to receive the <u>NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver</u> from the date of discharge or retirement and either until completion of the degree

program in which the Guardsman soldier or airman is enrolled or for five (5) years, whichever comes first. d. (d)(1) To maintain eligibility, a Guardsman soldier or airman must not drop more than six (6) credit hours during a course of study. (2) however However, this does not include dropping classes before the add/drop-add or drop date. (3) A course of study is defined as the time during which a student is continuously enrolled in pursuit of a credential. **Authority.** Arkansas Code § 6-60-214. 3-5. 6 CAR § 530-305. Termination. (a) If a Guardsmansoldier or airman is dismissed from any institution of higher education for academic or disciplinary reasons, or drops a course after the drop/add-add or drop date that exceeds the cumulative continuation of eligibility limits, the Guardsman soldier or airman may be: (1) ineligible Ineligible for the receiving the National Guard Tuition Waiver receiving the National Guard Tuition Waiver, the soldier or airman will remain eligible for a period of time equal to the semester in which they were enrolled. (c) In the event of a medical discharge or medical retirement as a result of illness or injury incurred in the line of duty, as the result of a state or federal activation or a terrorist action as determined by the Governor, the soldier or airman is eligible to receive the National Guard Tuition Waiver from for a period of time equal to the semester in which they were enrolled. - (3) Failure to maintain eligibility status with the Arkansas National Guard for the entire semester in which the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver was awarded; or
- (4) Identification of courses dropped after the add/drop add or drop date in excess of the six (6) credit hours allowance in paragraph 3-4.d6 CAR § 530-304(d).
- b. (b) Recoupment may be collected by the respective institution in which the Guardsman soldier or airman is enrolled or by the ADHE-Division of Higher Education if funds were already paid on the Guardsman soldier's or airman's behalf.
- C. (c)(1) The Adjutant General may initiate recoupment of ALL-all funds paid on a Guardsmansoldier's or airman's behalf using the NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver when the Guardsmansoldier or airman engages in misconduct or fails to remain a satisfactory participant- in active drilling status with the Arkansas National Guard (as defined in Chapter 11 and Chapter 12 of ARArmy Regulation 135-178 and AFIAir Force Instruction is 36-3208 and 3209) that governs misconduct).
 (2) Any funds recouped will be returned to the State of Arkansas.

(b) Federal and state grants and scholarships awarded to <u>Guardsmensoldiers and airmen</u> via <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (FAFSA)</u>-and <u>YOUniversal Scholarship Application</u> <u>Management System</u> applications will be applied to tuition before the <u>NGTW-National Guard Tuition</u> Waiver is applied.
- **c.** (c) Grants and scholarships awarded by the institution in which the Guardsmansoldier or airman is enrolled will be applied toward tuition before NGTW the National Guard Tuition Waiver is applied.
- d. (d)(1) Guardsmen Soldiers and airmen may, but are not required to, use the NGTW-National Guard Tuition Waiver simultaneously with the Montgomery GI Bill (all Chapterschapters) and the Kicker.
- (2) The NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver will be applied to tuition before GI Bill funds are applied.
- e. (e) GuardsmenSoldiers and airmen may, but are not required to, use Federal Tuition Assistance federal tuition assistance with the NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver. Federal tuition assistance here refers to Federal Tuition Assistance programs established by the Department of Defense. It does not include FAFSA funds which must be applied as outlined in paragraph (b) above. If used, FTA funds will be applied to tuition before the National Guard Tuition Waiver is applied.
- f. (f)(1) NGTWThe -National Guard Tuition Waiver used within a term will apply to all courses enrolled for that term, excluding those dropped before the institution's add/drop add or drop date.
- (2) All such course enrollments for that term will count toward the <u>one hundred twenty</u> (120) credit hour NGTW National Guard Tuition Waiver limit.
