Notes	- Specialized	These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (Intensive Supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Supervision Response Team).					
Run Date Content Date Description	- Indirect	These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in Non-Reporting status, those on Suspended Sentences (SIS), and Interstate Compact offenders. Offenders on Annual Supervision are also included in this group.					
	4. Regular and Specialty Court caseload calculations included only offenders with Active (Direct), Electronic Monitoring, and Incarcerated supervision statuses, and further excludes those offenders whose risk classification has placed them on Annual Supervision.
