	- Regular	These are officers carrying normal Probation and Parole caseloads.
	- Specialty Court	These officers supervise offenders in specialty courts. Note that these officers may also carry regular P&P offenders, and these offenders are reflected in the specialty court caseload/workload figures; however, separate caseload/workload ratios are calculated for the regular and specialty court portions of a specialty court officer's caseload, in addition to a combined, or mixed, ratio.
Notes	- Specialized	These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (Intensive Supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Supervision Response Team).
ř	- Indirect	These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in Non-Reporting status, those on Suspended Sentences (SIS), and Interstate Compact offenders. Offenders on Annual Supervision are also included in this group.
