





Retaining Walls

Mechanical Stabilized Earth (MSE)

- Universal Use in Transportation
- Unit Cost Goes Down as Height Goes Up
 - Range \$26 \$83 / square foot
 - Typically Stronger
 - Aesthetics / Continuity




Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) Retaining Walls



Maximum 25 feet high Low Height Usually Less Expensive Range \$20 - \$76 / square foot Not used at Bridge Abutments



Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) Versus Modular Block

- Reported: \$15 Million job in Jacksonville could have been built for \$4 Million using Modular Block Retaining Walls (i.e., Segmented Panels)
- Response:
 - 1. No \$15 Million Job in Jacksonville
 - 2. No Jobs with \$11 Million Walls or Walls at 73% of Cost
 - 3. Department's Retaining Wall Committee Evaluates:
 - ✓ Case by Case Basis if < 25 feet
 </p>
 - ✓ MSE Walls used if > 25 feet.

Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) Versus Modular Block

Other States:

- 1. MSE walls are used 3x more than modular block walls nationwide
- 2. Limitations on modular block wall height:

✓ Colorado (20-30 feet))
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- ✓ Connecticut (8 feet)
- ✓ lowa (6 feet)
- ✓ Idaho (30 feet)
- ✓ Minnesota (12feet)
- ✓ South Dakota (10 feet)
- ✓ Wyoming (25 feet)

✓ Missouri (10 feet)

✓ Tennessee (Determined by Contractor)

✓ Louisiana (Determined by Contractor)

✓ Florida (8 feet)

✓ Georgia (20 feet)

Vice Chairman Tom Schueck moved, Commissioner Robert Moore seconded a motion to pursue a ballot measure for a highway program for the November 2018 election.


The motion passed unanimously.

It was clarified that this action includes evaluating both an Initiated Act and a Constitutional Amendment.


