#### **Master Plans**

- Set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-21-114, 6-21-801 et seq., and 25-15-201 et seq.
- A six year plan required for each school district
- Due February 1, of even year
- Must be updated February 1, of odd year
- Division must approve Master Plans by September 1, of even year

#### **Master Plans**

- Purpose of the Academic Facilities Master Plan:
  - Establish mechanism for state supervision of district activities impacting academic facilities
  - Develop and continually update information critical to identifying needs across the state
  - Allow state to manage state financial participation (SFP) in eligible academic facilities projects

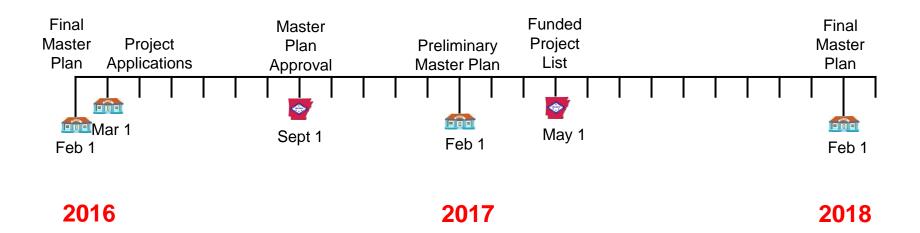
#### **Master Plans**

- Facilities Master Plan must contain:
  - Enrollment projections for ten years
  - Strategy for maintaining, repairing, renovating, and improving academic facilities
  - Other information required by law

#### **Partnership Program**

- Set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-21-114, 6-20-2507, 6-20-2512, 25-15-201 et seq., and Act 936 of 2015, and Act 962 of 2015
  - To provide state financial participation (SFP) in the form of cash payments
  - For eligible new construction projects
  - Based upon local district's academic facilities wealth index

#### **2017-2019 Partnership Program Timelines**



#### **Academic Facilities Wealth Index**

- School district share of project
- Complex computation of value of one mill per student
- Each district compared to the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile district
- Wealth Index goes up (becomes wealthier) if district loses students or gains assessment
- Wealth Index goes down (becomes poorer) if district gains students or loses assessment

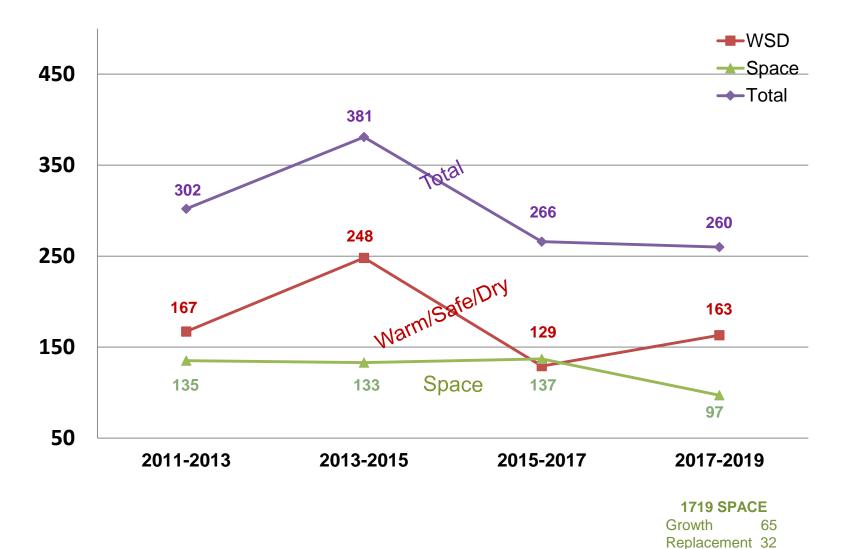

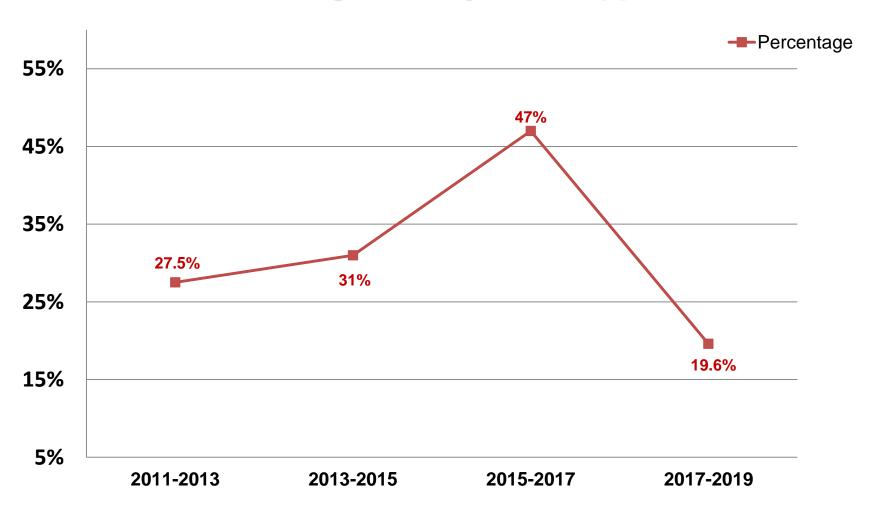

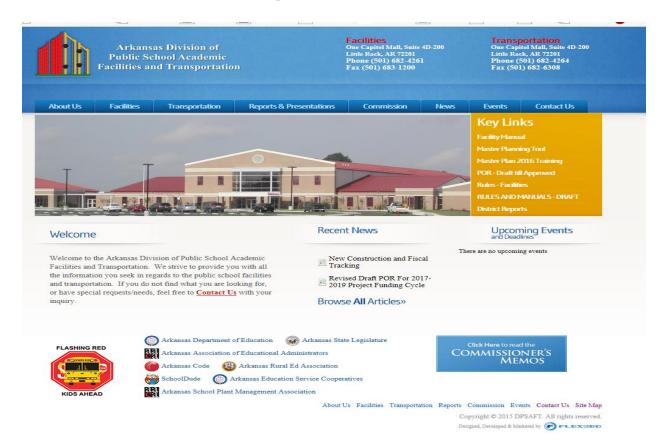
