22	with the Department of Education, and the Department of Education should monitor compliance with
23	those plans; and that this act is immediately necessary because the determination of educational
24	strategies and the use of public funds to develop and implement school improvement plans depends on
25	early planning by public school districts; that if these plans are not developed by the expiration of the
26	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
27	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last
28	house overrides the veto.
