Understanding "Co-Occurrence" between mental health and substance abuse...

Where will our resources have the biggest impact...?? A high initial cost for treatment may reduce recidivism...therefore lowering the overall inmate costs over time.

- Incorporate REGIONAL MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS TREATMENT CENTERS.
- Develop COMMUNITY-BASED TREATMENT CENTERS.
- Locate in easily accessible areas.
- Consider the symbiotic relationships to other services and programs.

The 'pool' from which Possible staff will be recruited is getting older too..



"Prisons simply are not physically designed to accommodate the infirmities that come with age,"

"the number of people in prison requiring significant agerelated medical care has risen and will continue to rise at a substantial rate given existing population trends."

We have now reached what Fordham University Professor Tina Maschi calls a "critical Omega point"5 in which both the sheer number and the specialized needs of the aging prison population have begun to surpass correctional facilities' capability to provide effective and humane care.

Approximately 40% of inmates 55 and older have a diagnosis of cognitive impairment.

As of 2007, less than 5 percent of state correctional institutions in the U.S. provided any form of geriatric-specific services, and there are currently few evidence-based models targeting aging individuals within correctional facilities.

Approximately 40% of inmates 55 and older have a diagnosis of cognitive impairment.

What can Arkansas do...??

Aging in house vs. Parole / compassionate release

- •In-house hospice programs. This benefits both inmate-caregiver and the aging population.
- Cognitive Impairment diagnosis training for officers and staff.
- Assisted Living wings or facilities.

The facility includes 1,440 beds in general population housing, 128 beds in mental health housing, 100 beds in assisted living housing, 27 beds in the hospice/infirmary, 48 in segregated housing, and 200 beds in outside minimum security housing.



RE-ENTRY PROGRAMS

Facilities that look more like a home and less like a jail...

Location....Location.....close to inmates family, support group, and job.


