BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF BENTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, A RESOLUTION TO BE ENTITLED:

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RURAL COUNTY MANDATE RELIEF ACT OF 2011

WHEREAS, in 1992, the United States Congress passed and the President signed Public Law 102-388, which in § 406(a) provided that the Secretary of Transportation was authorized to revise the "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" to include a standard for a minimum level of **retrore-flectivity** that must be maintained for pavement markings and signs, which shall apply to all roads open to public travel; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Transportation has made such revisions to the "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" which would affect Benton County due to new standards regarding signage; and

WHEREAS, the County administration has indicated that compliance with the revisions to the "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" would place a large burden on County financial resources; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 2442, the Rural County Mandate Relief Act of 2011 has been introduced in the United States House of Representatives, the effect of which would be to repeal Section 406(a) of Public Law 102-388.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF BENTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS

ARTICLE 1. That Benton County, Arkansas, hereby calls on the United States Congress to adopt and the President to sign H.R. 2442, known as the Rural County Mandate Relief Act of 2011.

ARTICLE 2. That the County Clerk is directed to send copies of this resolution to the two Senators and four Representatives representing the State of Arkansas in the United States Congress, and also to the President of the United States.
