










Transportation alternatives are limited to truck, loading on barge or single car railcar load outs. Accessible Unit Train loading is essential to expanding markets

COMMENTS FROM A COAL FORUM FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

HELD AT CITY HALL, MANSFIELD, ARKANSAS ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2015

APPROXIMATELY 50 PEOPLE ATTENDED INCLUDING: 6 AREA MAYORS, SENATOR TERRY RICE, REPRESENTATIVE MARCUS RICHMOND, REPRESENTATIVE JON EUBANKS;
REPRESENTATIVES FROM TWO LOCAL MINES; A REPRESENTATIVE FROM WEST FRASER LUMBER COMPANY; COUNTY JUDGES FROM SCOTT AND SEBASTIAN COUNTIES; DREW WILLIAMS, AEDC; TRACEE MCKENNA, WAPDD; AND FIELD REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE OFFICES OF SENATOR BOOZMAN, SENATOR COTTON, REPRESENTATIVE WESTERMAN. THOSE ATTENDING THE FORUM CAME FROM POTEAU, OKLAHOMA EAST TO MORRILTON, ARKANSAS.

THE DISCUSSION CENTERED ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR THIS AREA IN REFERENCE TO OUR RESOURCES AND THE WORK ETHIC OF THE RESIDENTS. A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF JOBS COULD DEVELOP IF ADEQUATE TRANSPORTATION OPPORTUNITIES EXPANDED TO INCLUDE A RAILWAY FROM HOWE, OKLAHOMA TO THE BOONEVILLE AREA AND BEYOND.

WEST FRASER LUMBER COMPANY IS INCREASING ITS VOLUME OF LUMBER TO 125 MILLION BOARD FEET PER YEAR. THE TWO NEARBY COAL MINES WOULD INCREASE ITS OUTPUT OF COAL IF RAIL SERVICE WERE AVAILABLE. THE RAIL SERVICE WOULD BE A COMPETITIVE TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVE TO TRUCKING.

THE DISCUSSION EXPLORED THE POSSIBILITY OF EXTENDING THE RAILWAY FROM HOWE, OKLAHOMA TO Ola, ARKANSAS.

ALSO, THE GROUP ACKNOWLEDGED THAT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WOULD INCREASE AS I-49 AND THE RAILWAY ARE CONSTRUCTED.

SEVERAL SMALL GROUP MEETINGS FOLLOWED THE FORUM TO LOOK AT THE TRANSPORTATION ISSUE. THAT IS WHY WE ARE HERE TODAY. WE WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR CONSIDERATION FOR OTHER TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES IN ADDITION TO HIGHWAYS.
