FARM TO FUEL: TECHNOLOGIES ADVANCED & SOLD IN THE ARKANSAS DELTA

Hosted by AAEF & alt. Consulting; Tuesday, October 29, 2013 in DeWitt, AR

Purpose of Event: To effectively demonstrate how the farm to fuel project can potentially alter the economic future of the Arkansas Delta, rich with natural resources and entrepreneurship.

Event Description: The Arkansas Advanced Energy Foundation (AAEF) convenes state economic development and workforce planners, researchers, and business and thought leaders to examine best practices which encourage innovation and entrepreneurship in the advanced energy sector. AAEF, in partnership with alt.Consulting, is proud to launch the first mini-biorefinery in DeWitt, Arkansas on October 29, 2013.

When the first gallon of biodiesel is produced by this facility, it will mark a major milestone in the *Farm to Fuel* project. On October 29, AAEF and alt.Consulting will convene Delta farmers, entrepreneurs, educators, VIPs across the region, local and state government officials, and advanced energy business leaders across AR to celebrate this microbiorefinery technology that is entirely developed and commercialized in the Arkansas Delta. As the *Farm to Fuel* project matures, rural communities across the region will have the capacity to generate, utilize, and market millions of gallons of biodiesel produced from local energy crop feedstocks grown and harvested just miles away.
