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Grant Overview

- AWARE : Advancing Wellness And Resiliency in Education
- Awarding Federal Agency: Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)
- Funding Cycle: September 30, 2018 through September 29, 2023;
 5 years
- Funding Amount: 1.8 Million annually



Key Goals for the Program

Develop model <u>comprehensive school-based mental health programs</u> and build the capacity of educators to identify and address the needs of students. The program will accomplish the following:

- 1. Focus <u>Prevention</u>- Build <u>Safe and Supporting school climates</u> (PBIS /Mental Health First Aid Trauma Informed Schools, ACE awareness)
- Focus <u>Intervention</u>-Comprehensive School- based and linked MH services Develop 3 distinct models across the state which are scalable to any district in Arkansas (Texarkana, Marvel-Elaine, OUR Cooperative (Ozark Mountain, Valley Springs, Eureka Springs)
- **3. Follow-up** Data collection and Evaluation



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Develop model <u>comprehensive school-based mental health programs</u> and build the capacity of educators to identify and address some of the needs of our students in our state. The program will accomplish the following:

- 1. Focus **Prevention** Build **Safe and Supporting school climates** (PBIS /Mental Health First Aid Trauma Informed Schools, ACE awareness)
- PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention System) a systematic approach to behavior expectations and consistent positive discipline practices with in a school setting
- Mental Health First Aid (Provides layperson with basic training to intervene in the presence of someone in crisis. (has been described as the equivalent to CPR to the health care field).
 - 150 Train The trainers at the end of 5 years
 - Arkansas currently has the lowest rate of MHFAiders in the nation
 - CJI is attempting to secure funding for MHFA for Law Enforcement, including SROs
 - Trauma informed schools provides for understanding and awareness for school staff students with behavior diagnosis. Provides for resources and opportunities to develop a supportive school environment for students and staff.

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- 2. Focus Intervention-Comprehensive School- based and linked MH services Develop 3 distinct models across the state which are scalable to any district in Arkansas (Texarkana, Marvel-Elaine, OUR Cooperative (Ozark Mountain, Valley Springs, Eureka Springs)
 - Each site will employ the following
 - Licensed Mental Health Professional
 - Behavioral Specialist
 - Project Coordinator
 - Schools are a key component in outcome based care, and aligns with the State efforts to implement organized care model (PASSE).



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- 3. Follow-up Data collection and Evaluation
 - SHAPE Assessment (School Health Assessment and Performance Evaluation System)
 - Utilization of Student GPS
 - Implementation data, Behavior and discipline data



State Personnel Resources

- The ADE will employ a Project Aware Coordinator to oversee the direct grant activities and to provide technical assistance and training
- The ADE and DHS/DBHS will create a formal partnership to jointly employ a
 Project AWARE Co-Coordinator; this will allow the ADE and DHS to work
 together collectively specifically to support this aspect of school-based health
 strategies.
