

42% of enrolled adult education and literacy students were between 25 and 44 years old



Enrolled Students' Proficiency Levels



 - This equals 79% of the enrolled students who took both the pretest and the post-test


























- 38,560 students were served in adult education/literacy programs.


Enrolled Students' Proficiency Levels (0-12.9 Grade Level Equivalent, plus ESL)

4,286 or 19% of all students enrolled in Adult Education Programs & Literacy Councils were learning English as a Second Language.







 How many Arkansans passed the General Educational Development (GED®) Tests in 2012?








1,613 or 41% of unemployed learners obtained a job within three months after exiting Adult Education programs/Literacy Councils.
