




# Greers Ferry Lake

Greers Ferry Lake offers a multitude of recreational opportunities to more than 6.8 million visitors annually with a fee collection total of over \$1.2 million making Greers Ferry Project among the highest in the nation in use fee collections. The Corps oversees 14 recreation areas with over 1200 campsites.

# 4th Grade Outreach

	<b>Scully's Tips for Boating Safety</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Know your boat – each boat has its own purpose. Make sure you use your boat correctly.</li> <li>2. Always wear a life jacket while riding on a boat.</li> <li>3. Make sure a responsible adult is operating the boat.</li> <li>4. Don't go in the boat if the operator has been drinking alcohol.</li> <li>5. Ride a PWC only with an experienced adult driver.</li> <li>6. Don't stand in a small boat.</li> <li>7. Don't sit on the gunwale or bow of a moving boat.</li> <li>8. Know your state's laws governing boating and fishing.</li> </ol>
	<b>Topher's Rules for Safe Swimming</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Learn to swim.</li> <li>2. Always swim with a buddy.</li> <li>3. Swim in a designated area and make sure an adult watches you.</li> <li>4. Wear a life jacket if you can't swim or if you are just learning to swim.</li> <li>5. An air mattress or swim ring does not take the place of a life jacket.</li> <li>6. Don't swim in cold water.</li> <li>7. Never dive or jump into unknown waters.</li> <li>8. No drugs or alcohol.</li> <li>9. Obey all "No Swimming" and other warning signs.</li> <li>10. Never swim in a canal.</li> </ol>
	<b>Wanda's Rules Around Dams, Rivers, and Canals</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Never boat just above or just below a dam... Don't go past buoys, signs, ropes or lights that warn of a dam. Don't boat or paddle near a low level dam.</li> <li>2. Stay away from canals – currents and undertows hide beneath the surface.</li> <li>3. Remember that rivers can have strong currents and hidden dangers beneath the surface. Some rivers have waterfalls where the water drops hundreds of feet.</li> <li>4. Watch out for rapids or whitewater.</li> <li>5. Watch out for fallen trees and broken limbs in a river.</li> <li>6. Remember that cold water can cause hypothermia.</li> </ol>
	<b>Sam's Guidelines for Water Rescue</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. REACH: Hold on to the dock or your boat and reach your hand, a boat oar, a fishing pole, or whatever you have nearby to the person in the water.</li> <li>2. THROW: If you can't reach far enough, toss things that float for the person to grab.</li> <li>3. ROW: If you're in a boat, use the oars to move the boat closer to the person in the water, or call out to a nearby boat for help. Don't use the boat's motor close to a person in the water, the propeller could injure them.</li> <li>4. DON'T GO: Don't go into the water unless you are trained. Yell for help.</li> <li>5. Practice a rescue. Lean first aid for hypothermia and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).</li> </ol>

# Swim Beaches




During the Summer of 2011, Park Ranger's Patrolling Swim Beaches have made 13,153 documented direct contacts with swimmers in or at the water's edge.





# Life Jacket Loaner Boards

- Established in 2010, The Bi-lingual Greers Ferry Life Jacket Loaner Boards established the standard for the nation.
- Every Corps Park on Greers Ferry Lake has a Loaner Board at their swim beach.
- Not intended for boating.



# Boating Safety

- During most typical summers, USACE Greers Ferry Lake had a Lake Patrol Boat on the water nearly every weekend and during major holidays and special events.
- Water safety saturations were coordinated in conjunction with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and the Cleburne County Sheriff's Department.
- During the 2011 season, Ranger checked 2053 boats making contact with 8850 visitors.
- Statistics from the boat checks revealed user's trends and water safety habits.
