Arkansas Interoperable Communications Committee

- Practitioners from all disciplines
- All levels of government
- Provides the 'voice of the user' on critical issues

Arkansas Interoperable Communications Executive Committee

- Stakeholder agencies (ASP, ADEM, DIS, ANG, DFA, Judges Association, Emergency Management Association, City of Little Rock)
- Develops and implements policies and procedures for using AWIN
- Provides oversight and guidance

Roles and Responsibilities



- DIS AWIN Operations
 - Day to day operations of AWIN
 - Tier 2 help desk for AWIN users
 - Coordination of maintenance activities with vendors and Arkansas State Police
 - Frequency coordination
 - Disaster response (as requested)
 - User management (service requests, provisioning of radios)
- Arkansas State Police
 - Civil maintenance at tower locations (grass, weeding, fencing)
 - Structure maintenance (Buildings and doors)
 - Light electrical (grounding, generator repair and maintenance)
- Motorola
 - Infrastructure maintenance
- Liebert
 - UPS maintenance
