Summary of Changes to the Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Swimming Pools

Deleted Definition of Air Bum Assist Backwash and NSPI.

Added definitions for ASPS, Backflow preventer, Breakpoint Chlorination, CDC, and Readily Accessible.

Added clarifying information for several definitions to be consistent with current recognized terminology and safety concerns.

Clarified language for plan review and the various types of pools submissions

SECTION VI WATER:

Clarified wording to include types of chemical and or samples that can be collected And wording restating the requirement that all piping must meet backflow prevention requirements.

Added wording to keep pools from having direct connections to the sewer lines.

Added consideration for pool design considerations and details and repair options for pools.

Added the requirement for marking changes in pool depth around built in benches in pools or spas and clarification of other markings required for pool safety.

Reduced turnover time to two hours for wading pools from four to two hours.

Detailed main drain and hydrostatic relief valve requirements.

Updating of suction fittings, flow rates, and safety requirements.
