



REVENUE STABILIZATION LAW

Act 1024 (HB1876) of 2019 and the Duplicate Identical Act 998 (SB597)

- The Revenue Stabilization Law allocates the amount of General Revenue to be distributed to State
 Agencies and Higher Education Institution. The legislature enacts an amendment to the Revenue
 Stabilization Law every year to prioritize and set the maximum amount of General Revenue to be
 distributed.
 - Sections 2 through 7 are clean up Sections to delete funds established in Arkansas Code but no longer utilized.
- Act 1024 of 2018 establishes the General Revenue Allocations that total \$5.75 billion dollars for Fiscal Year 2020 and prioritizes those distributions with three category listed as "A", "B" and "C".
- Category "A" must be fully funded before general revenues are distributed in Category "B".
 - o "A" allocates \$5.59 billion dollars to Agencies and Institutions, \$15.88 million dollars to the Rainy Day Fund and \$5.9 million dollars for the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund.
- After Category "A" is fully funded general revenue collections are distributed monthly to Category "B" which totals \$115.6 million dollars.
- After Category "B" is fully funded general revenue collections are distributed monthly to Category "C" for \$14.8 million dollars solely to replenish the Performance Fund.

 - Various Appropriations Authorized by the General Assembly, other than
 Development and Enhancement Fund Appropriations, which require prior approval

- Any Rainy Day funds not spent from the previous biennium (are carried forward) and General Revenue allocated in the Revenue Stabilization Act for the Rainy Day Fund shall not count against the \$30 million dollar Rainy Day Fund cap for the 2019-21 biennium.

Act 981 of 2019: State Agencies Uniform Classification and Compensation Act

- Act 981 made no changes to the current pay plan structure that was put in place in FY18. The
 majority of changes revolve around the movement of the Office of Personnel Management
 (OPM) from the Department of Finance and Administration to the Department of Transformation
 and Shared Services based on the Transformation and Efficiencies Act of 2019 (Act 910).
- OPM reports to the Secretary of the Department of Shared Services. The Secretary of the Department of Shared Services will work in conjunction with the Chief Fiscal Officer to determine the available funding for Annual Career Service Recognition Payments.
- Act 981 eliminated language in A.C.A 21-5-211 which provided for the pay plan implementation.
 This language dictated the amounts employees received in FY18 when the new pay plan was introduced.
- There is no Cost of Living Adjustment authorized in Act 981. However, employees are eligible for salary increases through A.C.A 21-5-1101 based on performance evaluations and the merit increase pay system.

Act 763 of 2019: Institutions of Higher Education Uniform Classification and Compensation Act

- Act 763 implemented a new pay plan structure for the institutions of higher education. The
 minimum salary levels were adjusted for each pay grade due to the new minimum wage
 standards. The salary maximums are adjusted for grades based on the new entry with 55%
 variation between the minimum and maximum of the grade. A 4% adjustment is established
 between the grades.
- To implement the new pay plan structure, the rate of compensation a classified employee will receive on July 1, 2019 is a one percent (1%) increase above the employee's current salary. This salary may allow an employee's compensation to exceed the maximum pay level amount set out for the position.
- In addition to the 1% compensation increase to the maximum annual salary on July 1, 2019, the salary may be increased by up to two percent (2%) with written approval by the Director of the Department of Higher Education; or more than two percent (2%) only with written approval of the director after review by the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee. The salary increase may be established as an increase to the employee's salary or as a lump sum.
- With the approval of the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, salaries may exceed the maximum pay level for the grade assigned by the classification by no more than twenty-five percent (25%) for no more than ten percent (10%) of the positions authorized in the institution's appropriation act.


CAREER SERVICE RECOGNITION PAYMENTS

Act 914 (House Bill 1706)

- Arkansas Code 21-5-106 and 21-5-1406 establish the annual career service recognition
 program for state employees, as well as non-faculty and classified employees at institutions of
 higher education. The program provides yearly lump sum payments to employees with 10
 years or more of service. The amount of the payments are increased as employees reach
 increased service milestones.
- Act 914 increases these career service payments for both state employees and employees of the institutions of higher education. The increases are:






Public School Fund – General Revenue



(1) Act 877 - The Department of Education Public School Fund provides the primary State financial assistance to Arkansas' public elementary and secondary schools.



(2) Act 425 - Vocational start up grants are awarded to schools to purchase capital equipment, nonconsumable supplies, and program software to start newly approved vocational programs of the occupational program areas, support the minimum required equipment to meet program standards, and support short-term adult skills training classes.



(3) Act 153 - Since 1937, the legislature has regularly appropriated funds for Aid to Public Libraries. These funds supplement local libraries resources. The purpose of Aid to Public Libraries is to encourage local library support, promote resource sharing, and improve local library resources. Aid to Public Libraries is funded by the State Library Public School Fund.

• The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$2,665,305 in FY2020 with (31) authorized positions and is funded with cash, general revenue, a grant from the Arkansas Department of Health using Master Tobacco Settlement monies for the sales to minors' checks and enforcement, and special revenue in the form of permit fees.

TOBACCO SETTLEMENT COMMISSION

Act 19 (SB34)

 The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$416,627 in FY2020 with (2) authorized positions and is funded with the interest earnings on the Tobacco Settlement Program Fund and Program Accounts.

TOWING AND RECOVERY BOARD, ARKANSAS

Act 10 (SB25)

• The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$317,706 in FY2020 with (5) authorized positions and is funded with cash funds from fees for licensure, safety permits, and penalties.

TRANSPORTATION, ARKANSAS DEPARTMENT OF

Act 158 (HB1214)

The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$2,992,679,000 in FY2020 with (4,712) authorized positions and is funded with federal revenue from grants from the U.S.
 Department of Transportation; special revenue from motor fuel taxes, half-percent sales/use tax, natural gas severance tax, vehicle licenses, and special permit fees; trust funds from employer and employee contributions; and general revenue

TREASURER OF STATE, OFFICE OF THE

Act 779 (HB1134)

- The Treasurer of State has a total authorized appropriation of \$6,094,852 in FY2020 with (35) authorized positions and is funded from the State Central Services Fund.
- Amendment added additional appropriation in the amount of \$830,063 funded from State Central Services for two new positions and position reclassifications and deleted the Investments – Cash appropriation.

Act 154 (HB1133)

• The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for the City/County Tourist Facilities Assistance appropriation which has a total authorized appropriation of \$887,908 in FY2020 and is funded from General Revenue. The Arkansas State Fair and Livestock Show Association is the last remaining participant in the City/County Tourist Facilities Assistance Program.

Act 1006 (HB1109)

• Code Amendment adds 5 additional years of \$887,908 annual payments to the Arkansas State Fair and Livestock Show Association from the City-County Tourist Facilities Aid Fund that runs from FY2021 to FY2025.

Act 118 (HB1136)

• The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for the Amendment 74 Property Tax Distribution which has a total authorized appropriation of \$1.5 billion in FY2020 to redistribute property tax collections to counties.

Act 47 (HB1131)

The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for the General Obligation Bonds which has a total
authorized appropriation of \$120 million for FY2020 including \$52 million for College and
Higher Education Bonds and \$68 million for Water, Waste Disposal and Pollution Abatement
to allow for the payment of the debt service on these bonds and is funded by General
Revenue.

Act 48 (HB1135)

• The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for Local Sales and use Taxes with a total appropriation of \$1.5 billion which provided an authorized appropriation of \$750 million for cities and \$750 million for counties in FY2020 to distribute their portion of collected sales and use taxes.

Act 67 (HB1132)

• The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for the Local Law Enforcement and Emergency Medical Assistance appropriations which total \$600,000 for FY2020 with \$300,000 each for operating expenses of the Arkansas Ambulance Association and Arkansas Association of Chiefs of Police and is payable from Special Revenues derived from traffic fines.

Act 49 (HB1137)

 The Treasurer is the disbursing officer for Animal Rescue Shelters which has a total appropriation of \$50,000 in FY2020 including \$25,000 for cities and \$25,000 for counties for operation of governmentally owned shelters and is funded from fees from special license plates.

TREASURER OF STATE - COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL AID

Act 747 (HB1139)

- County Aid has a total authorized appropriation of \$550,428,616 in FY2020 to provide spending authority for the Treasurer's Office to distribute General, Special and Federal Revenues to counties. The appropriation for General Revenue distribution is \$21,428,616 for FY2020.
- Amendment added \$5 million in appropriation to Special Revenues for Counties for passthrough funds from net gaming receipts.
- Municipal Aid has a total authorized appropriation of \$221,372,099 for FY2020 to provide spending authority for the Treasurer's Office to distribute General, Special and Federal Revenues to municipalities. The appropriation for General Revenue distribution is \$29,372,099 for FY2020.
- Amendment added \$10 million in appropriation to Special Revenues for Cities for passthrough funds from net gaming receipts.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

Act 718 (SB74)

- The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$36,212,949 in FY2020 with (290) authorized positions and is funded with Cash, Federal and General Revenue Funds.
- Per Governor's letter added appropriation totaling \$1,026,009 for personal services, operating expenses and maintenance expenses for Veterans Homes.

Act 484 (SB438)

• Supplemental appropriation for FY2019 for \$100,000 in Operations appropriation for personal services and operating expenses.

VETERANS' CHILD WELFARE SERVICE OFFICE, ARKANSAS

Act 92 (HB1086)

• The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$154,747 in FY2020 with (2) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue.

VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINING BOARD

Act 29 (HB1045)

• The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$115,868 in FY2020 with (1) authorized position and is funded with special revenue from license and exam fees.

WATERWAYS COMMISSION

Act 778 (HB1094)

- The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$7,309,799 in FY2020 with (3) authorized positions and is funded with fund balances, Ad Valorem Tax revenues, Inter-Agency transfers, and general revenue.
- Arkansas Waterways Commission Appropriation totals \$309,799 and includes an increase of \$50,000 to provide for anticipated Ad Valorem Tax Revenue increases as dedicated by Act 561 of 2019.
- Arkansas River Navigation System Expenses is a new appropriation added for \$2,000,000 to provide for River Navigation System activities and maintenance. Funding is dedicated by Act 561 of 2019.

WHEAT PROMOTION BOARD

Act 37 (HB1055)

 The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$444,494 in FY2020 with no authorized positions and is funded with special revenues comprised of a 1¢ per bushel assessment for wheat on the buyer at the point of sale or when it enters the USDA loan program and fund balances.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION

Act 54 (SB42)

• The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$33,596,520 in FY2020 with (115) authorized positions and is funded with fund balances, trust fund revenue and cash funds.

WORKFORCE SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF

Act 334 (SB94)

- The Agency has a total authorized appropriation of \$669,815,098 in FY2020 with (890) authorized positions and is funded with federal revenue, fund balances, stabilization tax revenues, general revenue, and advance interest funds.
- The purpose of the Excess Unemployment Benefits/Expenses Appropriation is changed by amendment to name specific programs administered by the Department of Workforce Services (DWS), including Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Workforce Opportunity Investment Act, and other employment programs administered by DWS.
