8	"AN ACT TO PROTECT THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PEOPLE OF
9	THE STATE OF ARKANSAS BY CREATING A STATEWIDE PROGRAM TO
10	PROMOTE PERSONAL AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND SELF-WORTH;
11	AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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15	SECTION 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.
16	(a) Millions of dollars are spent each year in Arkansas fighting
17	destruction created by our worsening social problems. Little improvement has
18	been seen as a result of the money spent through existing programs on these
19	problems. The costs expressed in human and societal terms are manifested in
20	broken families and broken lives, hopelessness, despair, and even death.
21	Moreover, these costs are steadily increasing.
22	(b) Research has established a causal relationship between a lack of
23	self-esteem and crime, violence, alcohol and drug abuse, welfare dependency,
24	high school dropouts, teen pregnancy, recidivism, child abuse and teen
25	suicide. People who esteem themselves are less likely to engage in these
26	types of destructive and self-destructive behavior and more likely to engage
27	in positive behavior and be productive members of society. Therefore, the
28	Arkansas General Assembly believes that the best and most cost effective
29	manner in which to solve these problems is to address the root causes which
30	are a lack of self-worth and no sense of personal and social responsibility.
31	In order to accomplish that, a program to promote personal and social
32	responsibility and self-worth is necessary. An effort should be made to
33	coordinate a statewide program through county task forces with local
34	volunteers who will work together to develop plans for their areas to
35	eliminate or reduce these social problems which are weakening our state and

1 destroying its future.

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3 SECTION 2. (a) There is hereby established the Joint Interim 4 Subcommittee on Personal and Social Responsibility and Self-Worth of the Joint 5 Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Labor and the Joint Interim 6 Committee on Education to be composed of the following members: 7 Three (3) members of the Joint Interim Committee on Public (1)8 Health, Welfare and Labor, one (1) Senator and two (2) Representatives; 9 Three (3) members of the Joint Interim Committee on (2) 10 Education, one (1) Senator and two (2) Representatives; 11 (3) The chairmen of the Joint Interim Committee on Public Health, 12 Welfare and Labor and the Joint Interim Committee on Education shall serve as 13 ex-officio members. 14 (b) The chairperson of this subcommittee shall be elected by the 15 members of the subcommittee at the first meeting. 16 (c) Members shall be paid mileage and per diem by their respective 17 Joint Interim Committees. 18 19 The purpose of this subcommittee shall be to: SECTION 3. 20 (1) ensure coordination and cooperation between state agencies on the 21 development of a statewide effort to promote personal and social 22 responsibility and self-worth; 23 (2) promote public awareness of the findings, policies and programs 24 most likely to be effective in building or restoring self-worth; 25 (3) encourage in each county the formation of a volunteer task force to 26 develop and initiate a program for promoting personal and social 27 responsibility and self-worth for the area; 28 (4)keep abreast of new research in the area; monitor results of the state agencies and local school districts 29 (5) 30 and report to the Arkansas General Assembly prior to the 1993 Regular Session 31 on the progress made and recommendations for the future; (6) generate an effort to inform the public of the relationship between 32 33 self-worth and the state's major social problems and how personal and social 34 responsibility and self-worth can be harmed, nurtured, and rebuilt and to 35 identify ways the public can become involved in the solution;

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(7) survey government and other public institutions, including
government agencies, school and public assistance programs to determine
whether the manner in which they treat people serves to dehumanize persons and
adversely affect their healthy sense of self-worth;

5 (8) determine ways in which nongovernmental institutions, including 6 family, social and religious organizations can be more supportive of the 7 development and perpetuation of healthy self-worth;

8 (9) develop early intervention programs for preschool children and work 9 with existing programs to strengthen them; and

10 (10) work with the Department of Education, Department of Higher 11 Education, Vocational-Technical Education Division of the Department of 12 Education, Department of Health, Department of Human Services, Department of 13 Correction, and other entities which the subcommittee may identify that impact 14 personal and social responsibility and self-worth in Arkansans to formulate 15 policy to recommend to the Arkansas General Assembly and the Governor to 16 promote personal and social responsibility and self-worth.

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18 SECTION 4. All departments, commissions, boards, agencies, officers, 19 and institutions and subdivisions of this state shall cooperate with the 20 subcommittee in carrying out the powers and purposes of this act. 21

22 SECTION 5. Three (3) months prior to the convening of the 1993 Regular 23 Session, the subcommittee shall submit a report to the Joint Interim Committee 24 on Public Health, Welfare and Labor and the Joint Interim Committee on 25 Education their findings and recommendations.

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SECTION 6. The subcommittee, the Governor, the Arkansas General Assembly and state agencies shall encourage the development of a group of volunteers in each county to act as a county task force. In large or highly populated areas, these task forces may break into subcommittees representing a particular community. The task force shall be made up of a wide variety of people representing all citizens in the county, including local school districts, institutions of higher learning, service agencies, business leaders, parents, and others interested in promoting personal and social responsibility and self-worth.

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2 SECTION 7. The county task forces shall develop a plan for instituting 3 a program to promote personal and social responsibility and self-worth in 4 their counties. The program shall be designed to include as many groups of 5 people as possible, but should begin with parents, children and teachers. 6

7 SECTION 8. These county task forces shall promote the exercise of 8 responsible citizenship, so as to enable individuals to become personally 9 involved in the creation of policies, programs and environments, that will 10 enhance personal and social responsibility and self-worth, and therefore, 11 responsible citizenship in their counties.

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13 SECTION 9. The State Board of Education shall adopt as one of its goals 14 the promotion of personal and social responsibility and self-worth. The State 15 Board of Education shall direct the Department of Education to work with the 16 subcommittee, the Department of Health and other state agencies as needed to 17 implement a program of personal and social responsibility and self-worth. 18

19 SECTION 10. The Department of Education shall require schools to include 20 in their curriculum instruction promoting personal and social responsibility 21 and self-worth for all students from kindergarten through high school. The 22 Department of Education shall require a method for addressing the goal of 23 promoting personal and social responsibility and self-worth to be included in 24 the district and individual school plan, required by the Education Planning 25 Act of 1983 (Ark. Code Ann. §6-15-101).

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27 SECTION 11. Each school district within a particular county shall 28 appoint a person to the appropriate county task force once established. Each 29 school district shall make the promotion of personal and social responsibility 30 and self-worth a priority. The in-service curriculum of each district shall 31 include training in the promotion of personal and social responsibility and 32 self-worth.

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34 SECTION 12. Each institution of higher education shall adopt as one of 35 its goals the promotion of personal and social responsibility and self-worth.

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1 Each institution shall develop a program which will include ways to achieve 2 this among the staff and faculty, as well as the students. In particular, 3 education and training should be incorporated into the curriculum of education 4 majors, in addition to other service-type majors, such as social work. In 5 counties which have county task forces, institutions shall appoint a person to 6 serve on this task force.

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8 SECTION 13. Each vocational-technical school shall review their policies 9 and curriculum to ensure that they do not operate in a manner which serves to 10 dehumanize persons. Each vocational-technical school shall develop a program 11 to promote personal and social responsibility and self-worth for their 12 institution both in the faculty and students. Vocational-technical schools 13 can play a major role in promoting self-worth, particularly in non-college-14 bound students. In counties which county task forces exists, schools shall 15 appoint a person to serve on this task force.

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SECTION 14. State agencies shall evaluate their policies, programs and staff to ensure that they do not operate in a manner which serves to dehumanize persons and adversely affect their healthy sense of self-worth. State agencies shall determine ways in which they, in particular their public assistance programs, can be more supportive of the development and perpetuation of a healthy sense of self-worth. These goals shall be incorporated into the orientation and training of new employees, as well as periodic in-service for existing employees. In counties which have county task forces, agencies shall appoint a person to serve on this task force.

27 SECTION 15. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent 28 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas 29 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 30

31 SECTION 16. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to 32 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 33 other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without 34 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 35 Act are declared to be severable.

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2 SECTION 17. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 3 hereby repealed.

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5 SECTION 18. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the 6 General Assembly that research has established a casual relationship between a 7 lack of self-worth and crime, violence, alcohol and drug abuse, welfare 8 dependency, high school dropouts, teen pregnancy, recidivism, child abuse and 9 teen suicide; that people who have a high sense of self-worth are less likely 10 to engage in these types of destructive and self-destructive behavior and more 11 likely to engage in positive behavior and be productive members of society; 12 that the creation of a legislative subcommittee is necessary to develop plans 13 to eliminate or reduce these social problems by enhancing one's sense of self-14 worth; and that this subcommittee needs to be created immediately in order to 15 address these problems. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist 16 and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health 17 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and 18 approval. 19 20 21 22

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
