HOUSE BILL

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON OR PERSONS OR
9 ANY ORGANIZATION OF PERSONS TO BURN OR ATTEMPT TO BURN ANY
10 MATERIAL OR TO OTHERWISE IGNITE ANY FIRE ON THE STATE
11 CAPITOL GROUNDS UNLESS SUCH PERSON OR ORGANIZATION FIRST
12 OBTAINS A PERMIT TO DO SO SIGNED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE
13 AND THE CHIEF OF THE LITTLE ROCK FIRE DEPARTMENT; AND FOR
14 OTHER PURPOSES."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

18 SECTION 1. It is unlawful for any person or organization to burn or
19 attempt to burn any material or otherwise ignite any fire on the State Capitol
20 grounds unless such person or organization has first obtained a permit to
21 conduct such burning signed by the Secretary of State as custodian of the
22 Capitol grounds, and by the Chief of the Little Rock Fire Department.

23 Provided, nothing herein shall be construed to apply to the smoking of
24 tobacco products on the State Capitol grounds.

25

26 SECTION 2. Any person or organization violating the provisions of this
27 act shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

28

29 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
30 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
31 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

32

33 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
34 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
35 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

1 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
2 act are declared to be severable.

3

4 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
5 hereby repealed.
