HOUSE BILL 1582

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES AND PURCHASE OF DATA PROCESSING
10 SERVICES FOR THE OFFICE OF THE TREASURER OF STATE FOR THE
11 BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER
12 PURPOSES."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

16 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
17 Office of the Treasurer of State for the 1991-93 biennium, the following
18 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
19 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
20 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
21 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary
22 is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said
23 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
24 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
25 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
26 successor.

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21 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Office
 22 of the Treasurer of State for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum
 23 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
 24 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: three (3) temporary
 25 or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those
 26 provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor,
 27 or this act for the appropriate classification.

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29 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Office
 30 of the Treasurer of State, to be payable from the State Central Services Fund,
 31 for personal services and operating expenses and purchase of data processing
 32 services of the Office of the Treasurer of State for the biennial period
 33 ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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14 *SECTION 4. There is hereby appropriated, to the Office of the Treasurer*
 15 *of State, to be payable from the County Aid Fund, for the purpose of*
 16 *distributing any monies provided by Highway Turnback, Severance Taxes to*
 17 *Counties, and any other monies provided by Acts of the General Assembly for*
 18 *the benefit of counties by the Office of the Treasurer of State which shall be*
 19 *supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 2 of Act*
 20 *171 of 1991, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:*

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25 *SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated, to the Office of the Treasurer*
 26 *of State, to be payable from the Municipal Aid Fund, for the purpose of*
 27 *distributing special revenues accruing therein for the benefit of*
 28 *municipalities, as provided by law, by the Office of the Treasurer of State*
 29 *which shall be supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in*
 30 *Section 7 of Act 171 of 1991, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993,*
 31 *the following:*

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36 *SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds*

1 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
3 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
6 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
7 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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10 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
12 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
13 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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19 SECTION 8. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
20 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
21 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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23 SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
24 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
25 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
26 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
27 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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29 SECTION 10. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
30 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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32 SECTION 11. HEALTH PREMIUMS. The Office of the Treasurer of State
33 shall not, during the 1992-93 fiscal year, spend more for health insurance per
34 employee than the amount being contributed to the State Employees Health
35 Insurance Program.

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SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
