The State Board of 22 Higher Education shall base these decisions on consultation with 23 representatives of the institutions of higher education, analysis of the 24 placement procedures presently used by institutions in Arkansas, statewide 25 placement testing programs in other states, and pilot projects involving 26 testing of entering freshmen at selected institutions in Arkansas. 27

SECTION 24. Of the maximum annual salary rates for unclassified positions established in Section 1 of this Act, the line item maximum salaries enumerated for the HIGHER ED DIRECTOR, HIGHER EDUCATION DEPUTY DIRECTOR, the 1 three (3) HIGHER ED ASSOCIATE DIRECTORS, HIGHER EDUCATION DP COORDINATOR, 2 HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATOR OF ACADEMIC PROGRAM, and HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENT 33 FINANCIAL AID MANAGER are recommended in an effort to establish compensational 4 parity between the Department of Higher Education and comparable positions at 55 public Institutions of Higher Education in Arkansas Code 6-61-203(b). It is

1 the intent of this legislation that no incumbent in the positions indicated 2 above shall be entitled to receive salary compensation in each year of the 3 biennium in excess of ten percent (10%) above their salary levels existent as 4 of June 30th of the previous year.

6 SECTION 25. The appropriation provided in Section 18 herein shall be 7 used to match an equal amount of funds as certified as available by the 8 various state-supported institutions of higher education from private sources 9 for supporting students in international studies or foreign languages. Upon 10 receiving certification from an institution of the amount set aside for such 11 purpose, the Department of Higher Education shall, under rules and regulations 12 promulgated by the Department, disburse the funds herein appropriated in an 13 equal amount to the institution. The institution shall utilize the interest 14 earnings of the funds received under this Act and the interest earnings from 15 the private sources so certified to assist students whose field of 16 concentration is that of international studies or of foreign languages. Such 17 assistance may be in the form of tuition, books, stipends, or travel expenses, 18 as determined by the Department of Higher Education.

20 SECTION 26. CARRY FORWARD. The unexpended balance of the appropriation 21 provided in Section 3 of this Act, General Operations, for capital outlay, as 22 of June 30, 1992 shall be carried forward and made available for the purpose 23 of completing the acquisition of a new agency computer system, through the 24 fiscal year ending June 30, 1993.

SECTION 27. 27 SECTION 28. In order to promote efficiency in the utilization of 28 educational resources and to reduce duplication of programs within service 29 areas of Arkansas' institutions of higher education, Arkansas Code §6-64-106, 30 Annotated, is hereby repealed. An expansion of nurse education programs in 31 northwest Arkansas, through cooperative agreements with public and private 32 institutions, has provided the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, with the 33 opportunity for developing and implementing a new Bachelor of Science in 34 Nursing degree during the 1991-93 biennium. SECTION 32. POOL POSITIONS. In order to provide the personnel 13 14 resources necessary to implement the technical college legislation enacted by 15 the 78th General Assembly, the Department of Higher Education is hereby 16 authorized twenty (20) "Pool Positions" for the 1991-93 biennium. Ten (10) of 17 the positions shall be line item maximum positions and ten (10) of the 18 positions shall be classified positions not to exceed Grade 24. The positions 19 authorized as "Pool Positions" may be activated upon approval by the Director 20 of the Department of Finance and Administration after review by the Office of 21 Personnel Management and the Arkansas Legislative Council. A pool position 22 will be assigned a grade and/or salary level not to exceed the grade and/or 23 salary level of comparable positions as defined by the Uniform Classification 24 and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.) or its successor, and 25 the regular salaries section of this Act. 2 SECTION 39. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 3 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 4 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 5 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control 8 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the 9 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

12 SECTION 40. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 13 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 14 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which 15 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

21 SECTION 41. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and 22 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and 23 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 24

25 SECTION 42. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the 26 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 27 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which 28 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 29 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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31 SECTION 43. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict 32 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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34 SECTION 44. HEALTH PREMIUMS. The Department of Higher Education shall 35 not, during the 1992-93 fiscal year, spend more for health insurance per

employee than the amount being contributed to the State Employees Health
 Insurance Program.

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4 SECTION 45. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the 5 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of 6 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year 7 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the 8 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, 9 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the 10 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm 11 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 12 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 13 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
