## **HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 REQUESTING THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH TO  
8 DEVELOP INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE  
9 ARKANSAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO DISSEMINATE TO ARKANSAS YOUTH  
10 CONCERNING RECENTLY ENACTED LEGISLATION AND AGENCY  
11 REGULATIONS ON THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTHOOD.

15 WHEREAS, Arkansas ranks second in the nation in the percentage of births  
16 to teenagers; and

17

18 WHEREAS, over fifty percent (50%) of the teenage parents never finish  
19 high school; and

20

21 WHEREAS, babies born to teenage mothers are more likely to be premature  
22 and of low birth rate; and

23

24 WHEREAS, Arkansas spends eighty-two million dollars (\$82,000,000) on  
25 AFDC, Food Stamps and Medicaid for teenage mothers and their children; and

27 WHEREAS, it is essential that Arkansas break this cycle of fourth  
28 generation teen pregnancies and reduce the level of public dependency; and

30 WHEREAS, the Joint Committee on Children and Youth has instructed its  
31 staff to research recently enacted legislation making birth parents more  
32 responsible for their children; and

34 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services  
35 have access to relevant rules and regulations; and

2        WHEREAS, the members of the General Assembly have a unique opportunity  
3 to address various school groups and other youth organizations; and

5        WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State of Arkansas that all  
6 youth be made aware that the birth of a child places a responsibility on the  
7 birth parents regardless of age;

10 NOW THEREFORE,

11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL  
12 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

14        THAT the Joint Committee on Children and Youth shall develop a package  
15 of material for dissemination to the General Assembly with the assistance of  
16 the Department of Human Services and the Department of Health and the public  
17 information officers of the House of Representatives and Senate.
