## **HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE  
8 SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PERMIT COMPLETION OF  
9 THE BUSINESS OF THE SESSION AND TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES  
10 FOR THE ORDERLY COMPLETION OF THE BUSINESS OF THE SESSION.

12 WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article V of the Constitution of the state of  
13 Arkansas provides that the regular biennial session of the General Assembly  
14 shall not exceed sixty days in duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the  
15 members elected to each house of the General Assembly; and

16 WHEREAS, the regular session of the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly was  
17 extended to Friday March 22, but it now appears that it will be impossible to  
18 complete the essential business of this session within that time and that a  
19 further extension of this regular session will be necessary to enable the  
20 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly to complete its business,

22 NOW THEREFORE,

23 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL  
24 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

25 SECTION 1. The regular session of the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly  
26 of the state of Arkansas is hereby extended until the completion of business  
27 in each house on April 15, 1991.

28 SECTION 2. The Seventy-Eighth General Assembly shall recess at the  
29 close of business on March 27, 1991, to reconvene at 12:00 noon on Monday,  
30 April 15 for the purpose of considering vetoes and correcting errors or  
31 oversights in appropriations, unless the President Pro Tem of the Senate and  
32 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, by joint proclamation, determine  
33 that reconvening of the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly on that date is  
34 unnecessary, in which event any five members of each house may adjourn the

1 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly sine die.
