9 "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR INCREASED CRIMINAL AND CIVIL
10 PENALTIES FOR ENVIRONMENTAL VIOLATIONS, TO CLARIFY THE
11 CIVIL AND ADMINISTRATIVE ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY OF THE
12 DEPARTMENT OF POLLUTION CONTROL AND ECOLOGY; AND FOR OTHER
13 PURPOSES."

14

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

16

17 SECTION 1. Purpose. The General Assembly finds and determines that the
18 criminal and civil penalties imposed by current law do not accurately reflect
19 the degree of concern which the state places upon its environmental resources.
20 The current criminal penalties for hazardous waste and other violations are
21 among the lowest in the nation. Civil penalties for violations of the state
22 water, air, solid waste and hazardous waste pollution control statutes are set
23 at the minimum necessary to receive federally delegated programs. In
24 declaring itself "The Natural State," the State of Arkansas demonstrated its
25 commitment to its environmental resources. This commitment must be reflected
26 in its environmental enforcement program. This act shall be liberally
27 construed so as to achieve remedial intent.

28

29 SECTION 2. Section 8-7-204 of the Arkansas Hazardous Waste Management
30 Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 "8-7-204. Criminal, Civil and Administrative Penalties.

32 (a) Criminal Penalties.

33 (1) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter, who
34 commits any unlawful act under it, or who violates any rule, regulation or
35 order of the commission or department shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

1 Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that
2 person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than one (1) year or a
3 fine of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or subject to
4 both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or
5 part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated shall
6 constitute a separate offense.

7 (2) (A) It shall be unlawful for a person to:

8 (i) Violate any provision of this subchapter, commit any
9 unlawful act under it, or violate any rule, regulation or order of the
10 commission or department, and leave the state or remove his person from the
11 jurisdiction of this state; or

12 (ii) Purposely or knowingly make any false statement,
13 representation or certification in any document required to be maintained
14 under this chapter, or falsify, tamper with or render inaccurate any
15 monitoring device, method or record required to be maintained under this
16 subchapter.

17 (B) A person who violates this subdivision (2) shall be
18 guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law,
19 upon conviction that person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than
20 five (5) years or a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or
21 subject to both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only,
22 each day or part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated
23 shall constitute a separate offense.

24 (3) Any person who treats, stores, transports, or disposes of any
25 hazardous wastes and purposely, knowingly or recklessly causes the release of
26 hazardous wastes into the environment in a manner not otherwise permitted by
27 law, or creates a substantial likelihood of endangering human health, animal
28 or plant life, or property shall be guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any
29 other provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that person shall be subject
30 to imprisonment for not more than ten (10) years or a fine of not more than
31 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or subject to both such fine and
32 imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or part of a day during
33 which the violation is continued or repeated shall constitute a separate
34 offense.

35 (4) Any person who treats, stores, transports, or disposes of any
36 hazardous waste and purposely, knowingly or recklessly causes the release of

1 hazardous wastes into the environment in a manner not otherwise permitted by
2 law, thereby placing another person in imminent danger of death or serious
3 bodily injury, shall be guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any other
4 provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that person shall be subject to
5 imprisonment for not more than twenty (20) years or a fine of not more than
6 two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), or subject to both such fine
7 and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or part of a day
8 during which the violation is continued or repeated shall constitute a
9 separate offense.

10 (5) Notwithstanding the limits on fines set in subsections (1)
11 through (4) above, if a person convicted under any of the above subsections
12 has derived pecuniary gains from commission of the offenses, then he may be
13 sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed twice the amount of the pecuniary gain.

14 (b) Civil Penalties.

15 The department is authorized to institute a civil action in any court of
16 competent jurisdiction to accomplish any or all of the following:

17 (1) Restrain any violation of, or compel compliance with, the
18 provisions of this subchapter and of any rules, regulations, orders, permits
19 or plans issued pursuant thereto;

20 (2) Affirmatively order that remedial measures be taken as may be
21 necessary or appropriate to implement or effectuate the purposes and intent of
22 this subchapter;

23 (3) Recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and
24 any other agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the
25 provisions of this subchapter, including but not limited to natural resource
26 damages;

27 (4) Assess civil penalties in an amount not to exceed twenty-five
28 thousand dollars (\$25,000) per day for violations of this subchapter and of
29 any rules, regulations, permits or plans issued pursuant thereto; or

30 (5) Recover civil penalties assessed pursuant to subsection (c)
31 of this section.

32 (c) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter and
33 regulations, rules, permits or plan issued pursuant thereto may be assessed an
34 administrative civil penalty not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars
35 (\$25,000) per violation. Each day of a continuing violation may be deemed a
36 separate violation for purposes of penalty assessment. No civil penalty may

1 be assessed until the person charged with the violation has been given the
2 opportunity for a hearing in accordance with regulations adopted by the
3 commission. All hearings and appeals arising under this subchapter shall be
4 conducted in accordance with the procedures prescribed by A.C.A. 8-4-205, 8-4-
5 212, and 8-4-218 -- 8-4-229. The procedures of this subsection may also be
6 used to recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and any
7 other agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the
8 provisions of this subchapter, including but not limited to natural resource
9 damages.

10 (d) *As an alternative to the limits on civil penalties set in*
11 *subsections (b) and (c) above, if a person found liable in actions brought*
12 *under any of the above subsections has derived pecuniary gain from commission*
13 *of the offenses, then he may be ordered to pay a civil penalty equal to the*
14 *amount of the pecuniary gain.*

15 (e)(1) All monies collected as reimbursement for expenses, costs and
16 damages to the department shall be deposited in the operating fund of the
17 department.

18 (2) All monies collected as civil penalties pursuant to this
19 section shall be deposited in the Emergency Response Fund as provided by
20 A.C.A. §8-7-410. The director, in his discretion, may accept in-kind services
21 in partial mitigation of cash penalties for projects or programs designed to
22 advance environmental interests, provided however that such services shall not
23 duplicate or augment services already provided by the department through
24 appropriations of the General Assembly.

25 (3) All monies collected to cover the costs, expenses or damages
26 of other agencies or subdivisions of the state, including natural resource
27 damages, shall be distributed to the appropriate governmental entity.

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29 SECTION 3. A.C.A. §8-4-103 of the Arkansas Water and Air Pollution
30 Control Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 "8-4-103. Criminal, Civil and Administrative Penalties.

32 (a) Criminal Penalties.

33 (1) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter, who
34 commits any unlawful act under it, or who violates any rule, regulation or
35 order of the commission or department shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

36 Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that

1 person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than one (1) year or a
2 fine of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or subject to
3 both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or
4 part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated shall
5 constitute a separate offense.

6 (2) (A) It shall be unlawful for a person to:

7 (i) Violate any provision of this subchapter, commit any
8 unlawful act under it, or violate any rule, regulation or order of the
9 commission or department, and leave the state or remove his person from the
10 jurisdiction of this state;

11 (ii) Purposely, knowingly or recklessly cause pollution of
12 the waters or air of the state in a manner not otherwise permitted by law, and
13 thereby create a substantial likelihood of adversely affecting human health,
14 animal or plant life, or property; or

15 (iii) Purposely or knowingly make any false statement,
16 representation or certification in any document required to be maintained
17 under this chapter, or falsify, tamper with or render inaccurate any
18 monitoring device, method or record required to be maintained under this
19 chapter.

20 (B) A person who violates this subdivision (2) shall be
21 guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law,
22 upon conviction that person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than
23 five (5) years or a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or
24 subject to both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only,
25 each day or part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated
26 shall constitute a separate offense.

27 (3) Any person who purposely, knowingly or recklessly causes pollution
28 of the waters or air of the state in a manner not otherwise permitted by law,
29 and thereby places another person in imminent danger of death or serious
30 bodily injury, shall be guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any other
31 provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that person shall be subject to
32 imprisonment for not more than twenty (20) years or a fine of not more than
33 two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), or subject to both such
34 fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or part of a
35 day during which the violation is continued or repeated shall constitute a

1 separate offense.

2 (4) Notwithstanding the limits on fines set in subsections (1) through
3 (3) above, if a person convicted under any of the above subsections has
4 derived or will derive pecuniary gains from commission of the offenses, then
5 he may be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed twice the amount of the
6 pecuniary gain.

7 (b) Civil Penalties.

8 The department is authorized to institute a civil action in any court of
9 competent jurisdiction to accomplish any or all of the following:

10 (1) Restrain any violation of, or compel compliance with, the
11 provisions of this subchapter and of any rules, regulations, orders, permits
12 or plans issued pursuant thereto;

13 (2) Affirmatively order that remedial measures be taken as may be
14 necessary or appropriate to implement or effectuate the purposes and intent of
15 this subchapter;

16 (3) Recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and
17 any other agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the
18 provisions of this subchapter, including but not limited to natural resource
19 damages;

20 (4) Assess civil penalties in an amount not to exceed ten
21 thousand dollars (\$10,000) per day for violations of this subchapter and of
22 any rules, regulations, permits or plans issued pursuant thereto; or

23 (5) Recover civil penalties assessed pursuant to subsection (c)
24 of this section.

25 (c) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter and
26 regulations, rules, permits or plan issued pursuant thereto may be assessed an
27 administrative civil penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per
28 violation. Each day of a continuing violation may be deemed a separate
29 violation for purposes of penalty assessment. No civil penalty may be
30 assessed until the person charged with the violation has been given the
31 opportunity for a hearing in accordance with regulations adopted by the
32 commission. All hearings and appeals arising under this subchapter shall be
33 conducted in accordance with the procedures prescribed by A.C.A. 8-4-205, 8-4-
34 212, and 8-4-218 -- 8-4-229. These administrative procedures may also be used
35 to recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and any other

1 agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the provisions
2 of this subchapter, including but not limited to natural resource damages.

3 (d) As an alternative to the limits on civil penalties set in
4 subsections (b) and (c) above, if a person found liable in actions brought
5 under any of the above subsections has derived pecuniary gain from commission
6 of the offenses, then he may be ordered to pay a civil penalty equal to the
7 amount of the pecuniary gain.

8 (e)(1) All monies collected as reimbursement for expenses, costs and
9 damages to the department shall be deposited in the operating fund of the
10 department.

11 (2) All monies collected as civil penalties shall be deposited in
12 the Emergency Response Fund as provided by A.C.A. §8-7-410. The director, in
13 his discretion, may accept in-kind services in partial mitigation of cash
14 penalties for projects or programs designed to advance environmental
15 interests, provided however that such services shall not duplicate or augment
16 services already provided by the department through appropriations of the
17 General Assembly.

18 (3) All monies collected which represent the costs, expenses or
19 damages of another agency or subdivision of the state shall be distributed to
20 the appropriate governmental entity.

21

22 SECTION 4. A.C.A. 8-6-204 of the Arkansas Solid Waste Management Code
23 is hereby amended to read as follows:

24 "8-6-204. Criminal, Civil and Administrative Penalties.

25 (a) Criminal Penalties.

26 (1) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter, who
27 commits any unlawful act under it, or who violates any rule, regulation or
28 order of the commission or department shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
29 Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law, upon conviction that
30 person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than one (1) year or a
31 fine of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or subject to
32 both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only, each day or
33 part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated shall
34 constitute a separate offense.

35 (2)(A) It shall be unlawful for a person to:

1 (i) Violate any provision of this subchapter, commit any
 2 unlawful act under it, or violate any rule, regulation or order of the
 3 commission or department, and leave the state or remove his person from the
 4 jurisdiction of this state;

5 (ii) Through the course of activities prohibited by this
 6 section, commit a violation of §8-4-103(a)(2)(A)(i); or

7 (iii) Purposely or knowingly make any false statement,
 8 representation or certification in any document required to be maintained
 9 under this chapter, or falsify, tamper with or render inaccurate any
 10 monitoring device, testing method or record required to be maintained under
 11 this chapter.

12 (B) A person who violates this subdivision (2) shall be
 13 guilty of a felony. Notwithstanding any other provisions of Arkansas law,
 14 upon conviction that person shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than
 15 five (5) years or a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or
 16 subject to both such fine and imprisonment. For the purpose of fines only,
 17 each day or part of a day during which the violation is continued or repeated
 18 shall constitute a separate offense.

19 (3) Notwithstanding the limits on fines set in subsections (1)
 20 and (2) above, if a person convicted under any of the above subsections has
 21 derived or will derive pecuniary gain from commission of the offenses, then he
 22 may be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed twice the amount of the pecuniary
 23 gain.

24 (b) Civil Penalties.

25 The department is authorized to institute a civil action in any court of
 26 competent jurisdiction to accomplish any or all of the following:

27 (1) Restrain any violation of, or compel compliance with, the
 28 provisions of this subchapter and of any rules, regulations, orders, permits,
 29 licenses or plans issued pursuant thereto;

30 (2) Affirmatively order that remedial measures be taken as may be
 31 necessary or appropriate to implement or effectuate the purposes and intent of
 32 this subchapter;

33 (3) Recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and
 34 any other agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the
 35 provisions of this subchapter, including natural resource damages;

1 (4) Assess civil penalties in an amount not to exceed ten
2 thousand dollars (\$10,000) per day for violations of this subchapter and of
3 any rules, regulations, permits or plans issued pursuant thereto; or

4 (5) Recover civil penalties assessed pursuant to subsection (c)
5 of this section.

6 (c) Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter and
7 regulations, rules, permits or plan issued pursuant thereto may be assessed an
8 administrative civil penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per
9 violation. Each day of a continuing violation may be deemed a separate
10 violation for purposes of penalty assessment. No civil penalty may be
11 assessed until the person charged with the violation has been given the
12 opportunity for a hearing in accordance with regulations adopted by the
13 commission. All hearings and appeals arising under this subchapter shall be
14 conducted in accordance with the procedures prescribed by A.C.A. 8-4-205, 8-4-
15 212, and 8-4-218 -- 8-4-229. These administrative procedures may also be used
16 to recover all costs, expenses and damages to the department and any other
17 agency or subdivision of the state in enforcing or effectuating the provisions
18 of this subchapter, including natural resource damages.

19 (d) *As an alternative to the limits on civil penalties set in*

24 (e)(1) All monies collected as reimbursement for expenses, costs and
25 damages to the department shall be deposited in the operating fund of the
26 department.

27 (2) All monies collected as civil penalties pursuant to this
28 section shall be deposited in the Emergency Response Fund as provided by
29 A.C.A. §8-7-410. The director, in his discretion, may accept in-kind services
30 in partial mitigation of cash penalties for projects or programs designed to
31 advance environmental interests, provided however that such services shall not
32 duplicate or augment services already provided by the department through
33 appropriations of the General Assembly.

34 (3) All monies collected which represent the costs, expenses or
35 damages of another agency or subdivision of the state shall be distributed to

1 the appropriate governmental entity.

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3 SECTION 5. Applicability of the Arkansas Criminal Code.

4 The following provisions of the Arkansas Criminal Code apply to the
5 criminal penalties imposed by Sections 2, 3, and 4 of this act.

6 (a) The culpable mental states referenced throughout this act shall
7 have the definitions set out in A.C.A. §5-2-202.

8 (b) Solicitation or conspiracy, as defined by Subchapters 3 and 4 of
9 Chapter 3 of the Arkansas Criminal Code, to commit any criminal act proscribed
10 by Sections 2, 3 or 4 of this act shall be punishable as follows:

11 (1) Any solicitation or conspiracy to commit an offense under
12 this act which is a misdemeanor shall be a misdemeanor subject to fines not to
13 exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) per day of violation or imprisonment
14 for more than six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment.

15 (2) Any solicitation or conspiracy to commit an offense under
16 this act which is a felony subject to fines of fifty thousand dollars
17 (\$50,000) per day or imprisonment up to five (5) years shall be a felony
18 subject to fines up to thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) per day or
19 imprisonment up to two (2) years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

20 (3) Any solicitation or conspiracy to commit an offense under
21 this act which is a felony subject to fines of one hundred thousand dollars
22 (\$100,000) per day or imprisonment up to ten (10) years shall be a felony
23 subject to fines up to seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) per day or
24 imprisonment up to seven (7) years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

25 (4) Any solicitation or conspiracy to commit an offense under
26 this act which is a felony subject to fines of two hundred fifty thousand
27 dollars (\$250,000) per day or imprisonment up to twenty (20) years shall be a
28 felony subject to fines up to one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)
29 per day or imprisonment up to fifteen (15) years, or both such fine and
30 imprisonment.

31 (c) In cases considering suspension of sentence or probation, efforts
32 or commitments by the defendant to remediate any adverse environmental effects
33 caused by his activities may be considered by the court to be "restitution" as
34 contemplated by A.C.A. §5-4-301.

35 (d) A business organization, its agents or officers may be found liable

1 under this act in accordance with the standards set forth in A.C.A. §5-2-501
2 et seq., and sentenced to pay fines in accordance with the provisions of
3 A.C.A. §5-4-201(d) and (e).

5 SECTION 6. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
6 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
7 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

8

9 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
11 other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
12 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
13 Act are declared to be severable.

14

15 SECTION 8. The provisions of this act shall be in addition and
16 supplemental to all other laws of Arkansas now in effect and shall repeal only
17 such laws or parts of laws as may be specifically in conflict with this act.

18

19 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the 78th
20 General Assembly that the sanctions imposed by current Arkansas law for
21 environmental violations are among the least stringent in the nation. Thus,
22 current law is inadequate to deter environmental violations, and in fact
23 extends an implicit invitation to irresponsible industries. Protection of the
24 environmental integrity of this state is essential to protect the public's
25 health and economic well-being. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to
26 exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
27 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
28 after its passage and approval.
