1 SECTION 33. APPROPRIATIONS - MATCHING GRANTS - STATE. There is hereby 2 3 appropriated, to the Department of Parks and Tourism, to be payable from the 4 Department of Parks and Tourism Fund Account, for matching grants of the 5 Department of Parks and Tourism for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, 6 the following: 7 8 ITEM FISCAL YEARS 9 NO. 1991-92 1992-93 10 (01) MATCHING GRANTS 74,556 \$ 74,556 11 SECTION 34. EXTRA HELP RESTRICTION. No employee of the Parks Division 12 13 of the Department of Parks and Tourism who is employed as "Extra Help" may 14 receive an amount to exceed eighty-five percent (85%) of the maximum annual 15 salary for a comparable position as authorized under Arkansas Code 21-5-201 et 16 seq. during any fiscal year, nor shall such employee be employed for a period 17 of time to exceed eighteen hundred hours (1800) in any single fiscal year. 18 SECTION 35. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in Section 3 19 20 of this Act for Parks and Museums System Deferred Maintenance shall be 21 expended only after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council 22 for a deferred maintenance program for the Park System. The funds provided 23 will be used for repair and upkeep of parks and museum facilities or the Ozark 24 Folk Center that have been deferred due to lack of funds in the individual 25 budgets of the parks and museums or of the Ozark Folk Center. 26 27 SECTION 36. CASH PRIZES. The Department of Parks & Tourism is hereby 28 authorized to award merchandise, gift certificates and cash prizes to 29 contestants in various special events authorized by the Director of State 30 Parks. Such prizes may be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners and 31 shall be payable from the maintenance and operation line item of the Parks 32 Cash Funds/Ozark Folk Center Cash Funds. The cash prizes, in aggregate, for 33 all contests, shall not exceed \$5,000 per fiscal year from each fund.

35 SECTION 37. BRONZE INDIAN. The Department of Parks & Tourism is hereby

1 authorized to utilize Maintenance and General Operation appropriations in 2 Section 3 of this Act for the care and upkeep of the Bronze Indian erected on 3 the Caddo River. SECTION 38. Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Parks and 6 Tourism - Great River Road for operating expenses by Item (03) in Section 25 7 of this Act, \$10,000 each year is to be utilized for the implementation of the 8 Mississippi River Domestic - International Marketing Plan. 9 SECTION 39. PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS. The Department of Parks and Tourism 23 is hereby authorized to purchase from "Maintenance and General Operations" 24 appropriations provided by this Act, uniforms for Parks personnel, Museum 25 Services personnel, Tourist Information Center personnel, and uniforms and 26 blazers to be used by employees of the Department of Parks and Tourism who are 27 staffing sports shows, travel shows and other special promotional programs and 28 special theme costumes or uniforms for state parks. Provided further, that 29 any clothing purchased under the provisions stated in this section shall 30 remain the property of the Department of Parks and Tourism and shall be 31 surrendered upon request of the Department or upon termination of employment 32 of the individual to whom the clothing was issued. 33 SECTION 42. REVENUE PRODUCING EQUIPMENT. The Department of Parks and 34 35 Tourism is hereby authorized to purchase "Revenue Producing Equipment" such as

1 boats, golf carts, etc., from the "Resale Purchase" line item. The resale 2 purchase line item or any cash funds shall not be used to purchase heavy 3 construction equipment. SECTION 43. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 6 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 7 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 8 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 10 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control 11 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the 12 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 13 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 14 15 SECTION 44. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 16 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 17 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which 18 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 19 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 20 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 21 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 22 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 23 SECTION 45. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and 2.4 25 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and 26 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 27 28 SECTION 46. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the 29 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 30 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which 31 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 32 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable. 33

11	operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
12	and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
13	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
14	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
15	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
16	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
