# A Bill

**SENATE BILL 451**

## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR  
10 MEDICAL SCIENCES - COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, FOR THE  
11 DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A REGIONALIZED POISON  
12 AND DRUG INFORMATION CENTER TO SERVE BOTH HEALTH CARE  
13 PROFESSIONALS AND THE LAY PUBLIC, FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD  
14 ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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18 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - POISON AND DRUG INFORMATION PROGRAM.

19 There is hereby established for the University of Arkansas for Medical  
20 Sciences - College of Pharmacy for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum  
21 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions  
22 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201  
23 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,  
24 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set  
25 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform  
26 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
27 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
28 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
29 successor.

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6 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS - POISON AND DRUG INFORMATION PROGRAM. There

7 is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences -

8 College of Pharmacy, to be payable from the State General Services Fund

9 Account, for personal services and operating expenses of the University of

10 Arkansas for Medical Sciences - College of Pharmacy, for the development and

11 implementation of a regionalized poison and drug information center to serve

12 both health care professionals and the lay public, for the biennial period

13 ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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28 SECTION 3. CARRY FORWARD. The unexpended balance of appropriation

29 provided for in Section 2 of this Act on June 30, 1992, shall be carried

30 forward and made available for the same purposes during the fiscal year ending

31 June 30, 1993.

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33 SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

34 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

35 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

36 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

1 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
2 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control  
3 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the  
4 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
5 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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7 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
8 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
9 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which  
10 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
11 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
12 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
13 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
14 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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16 SECTION 6. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent  
17 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas  
18 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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20 SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the  
21 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
22 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
23 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
24 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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26 SECTION 8. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
27 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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29 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
30 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of  
31 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year  
32 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the  
33 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,  
34 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the  
35 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm  
36 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental

1 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
2 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
3 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
