SENATE BILL

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PROJECTS AS
9 AUTHORIZED BY ACT 683 OF 1989, AS AMENDED, THE ARKANSAS
10 COLLEGE SAVINGS BOND ACT OF 1989 FOR THE INSTITUTIONS OF
11 HIGHER EDUCATION; AND FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF BOND ISSUANCE
12 COSTS OF THE ARKANSAS DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AUTHORITY, FOR
13 THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER
14 PURPOSES."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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18 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
19 Department of Higher Education, to be payable from the Higher Education
20 Projects Development Fund, for the development of projects at State
21 institutions of higher education and the payment of project costs and expenses
22 of the issuance of the bonds of the Arkansas College Savings General
23 Obligation Bonds Program, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the
24 sum of \$100,450,000.

26 SECTION 2. ALLOCATIONS. There is hereby allocated to the various State
27 institutions of higher education, the Department of Higher Education, and the
28 Arkansas Development Finance Authority for the projects set out herein, the
29 following amounts of the funds appropriated in Section 1 hereof, to the
30 various State institutions of higher education, the Department of Higher
31 Education, and the Arkansas Development Finance Authority, there to be used as
32 provided by law, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

4 If any new construction or renovation project is completed at a cost
5 less than the allocation provided in this Section, the unused allocation and
6 funding may, subject to approval of the State Board of Higher Education, be
7 reallocated to Equipment, Library, or Major Maintenance allocation(s) for that
8 institution of higher education.

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10 SECTION 3. The appropriations authorized in Section 1 of this Act will
11 be allocated based on the priority categories as recommended by the State
12 Board of Higher Education to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

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14 SECTION 4. The Department of Higher Education shall adopt rules and
15 regulations for the allocation of the funds appropriated by this Act to ensure
16 that the funds are allocated and expended in a manner consistent with the
17 provisions of the Internal Revenue Code applicable to the Arkansas College
18 Savings General Obligation Bond Program (Program). The funds appropriated and
19 allocated pursuant to this Act shall be allocated and expended pursuant to Act
20 683 of 1989, as amended, this Act, and the rules and regulations promulgated
21 hereunder and shall be exempt from any other provisions of state law which
22 conflicts with any provision of the rules and regulations which are required
23 to ensure the compliance of the Program with the applicable provisions of the
24 Internal Revenue Code.

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26 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
27 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
28 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
29 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
30 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
31 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
32 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
33 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
34 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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1 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
2 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
3 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
4 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
5 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
6 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
7 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
8 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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10 SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
11 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
12 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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14 SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
15 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
16 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
17 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
18 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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20 SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
21 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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23 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
24 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of
25 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year
26 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the
27 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
28 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
29 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
30 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
31 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
32 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
33 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.

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
