35 that unforeseen circumstances occur in either fiscal year which would

1 necessitate a transfer of the maximum allocation provided in Section 10 hereof 2 from one or more programs to another program or programs as enumerated in said 3 Section 10, the Mental Health Services Division with the approval of the 4 Director of the Department of Human Services shall make its request known, and 5 the reasons thereof, to the Office of Budget, Department of Finance and 6 Administration in such form and detail as may be required by the Chief Fiscal 7 Officer of the State. If approved, such transfer approval shall be 8 transmitted to the Research and Fiscal Services Division of the Bureau of 9 Legislative Research who shall make a report of the transfer and the reasons 10 thereof to the Arkansas Legislative Council at least quarterly. 11 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE AUDIT OF MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS. Every Mental 12 13 Health Center eligible to receive any of the funds appropriated in Item (01) 14 of Section 8 (State Assistance) of this Act shall, as a condition of receiving 15 any such funds, be subject to an annual audit of the overall operation of such 16 Mental Health Center by the Division of Legislative Audit. The Mental Health 17 Centers shall submit a budget to the Mental Health Services Division, 18 Department of Human Services, and the Arkansas Legislative Council and go 19 through the budget procedures process in the same manner as State departments, 20 agencies, institutions, boards and commissions. Budgets shall be submitted 21 based on operating revenues and expenses of each Center and each Center shall 22 provide information related to financial status requested by the Legislative 23 Council and/or Joint Budget Committee. 2.4 25 SECTION 13. APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. All funds appropriated under the 26 provisions of Item (01) of Section 8 (State Assistance) of this Act shall be 27 apportioned on the basis of three dollars and ninety-eight cents (\$3.98) per 28 capita for fiscal year 1991-92 and three dollars and ninety-eight cents 29 (\$3.98) per capita for fiscal year 1992-93 or so much thereof as funds shall 30 become available. Additional funds shall be apportioned on the basis of fifty 31 cents (\$.50) per capita or a one-to-one State/Local funds matching basis for 32 both years of the biennial period ending June 30, 1993. 33 SECTION 14. GRANTS-IN-AID - CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING FUNDS. 34 35 locally-operated Centers and Clinics certified by the Mental Health Services

1 Division are eligible to receive funds appropriated in Item (01) of Section 8

- 2 of this Act, and as a condition of receiving such funds they shall:
- 3 (1) Meet minimum standards of performance in the delivery of Mental
- 4 Health Services as defined by the Department of Human Services, Mental Health
- 5 Services Division.
- 6 (2) Supply statistical data to the Department of Human Services, Mental
- 7 Health Services Division.
- 8 (3) Establish and maintain a sound financial management system in
- 9 accordance with guidelines as set forth by the Department of Human Services,
- 10 Mental Health Services Division.
- 11 (4) Establish and maintain community support programs designed to
- 12 provide coordinated care and treatment to ensure ongoing therapeutic
- 13 involvement and individualized treatment for persons with long-term, severe
- 14 mental illness. Every community support program shall use a coordinated case
- 15 management system and shall provide or assure access to services for persons
- 16 with long-term, severe mental illness who reside within the respective
- 17 catchment area of the Center. At a minimum, each community support program
- 18 shall provide assessment, diagnosis, identification of persons in need of
- 19 services, case management, crisis intervention, psychiatric treatment
- 20 including medication services and supervision, counseling and psychotherapy,
- 21 activities of daily living, housing, protection and advocacy, and psychosocial
- 22 rehabilitation which may include services provided by day treatment programs.
- 23 (5) The Board of Directors of each Center or Clinic certified by the
- 24 Department of Human Services, Mental Health Services Division, shall adopt and
- 25 submit to the Deputy Director, Mental Health Services Division, in the form
- 26 and according to the procedures specified by the Deputy Director, Mental
- 27 Health Services Division, an annual plan for the delivery of community support
- 28 services for persons with long-term, severe mental illness. Each Center's
- 29 plan must be approved by the Deputy Director, Mental Health Services Division.
- 30 SECTION 15. FEDERAL FUNDS. It is the specific intent of the General
- 31 Assembly that in the event of the availability of federal funding during
- 32 either year of the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, that such funding be
- 33 utilized to conserve or reduce the expenditure of general revenue except where
- 34 prohibited by law.

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SECTION 16. TRANSFER PROVISION. Personnel positions and appropriations 2 provided for all programs of the Mental Health Services Division may be 3 reallocated when such actions are determined necessary to assure continued 4 delivery of satisfactory levels of services in any of the several programs 5 administered by the Mental Health Services Division. Such reallocations or 6 transfers shall be requested by the Director of the Department of Human 7 Services. Any saving made in State or Federal appropriations for regular salaries, 9 extra help, social security and retirement matching or maintenance and general 10 operations, and grants for approved projects, may, upon approval of the 11 Department of Finance and Administration, be transferred to the purchase of 12 services for persons with long-term mental illness and in the establishment, 13 operation and maintenance of facilities, centers or programs for this 14 population. 15 SECTION 17. TRANSFER PROVISION FOR STATE OPERATED COMMUNITY MENTAL 17 HEALTH CENTERS. If during either year of the biennial period ending June 30, 18 1993, one or both of the current state operated community mental health 19 centers (George W. Jackson Northeast Arkansas Mental Health Center, Jonesboro 20 or Greater Little Rock CMHC, Little Rock) acquire private non-profit status, 21 the Department of Human Services may reallocate or transfer appropriation and 22 funds to ensure the continued delivery of satisfactory levels of service. 23 Such reallocations or transfers shall be requested by the Director of the 24 Department of Human Services to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. Said 25 Chief Fiscal Officer shall submit such requests to the Legislative Council for 26 review. After review, George W. Jackson Northeast Arkansas Mental Health 27 Center and Greater Little Rock CMHC would participate in general revenue per 28 capita distributions at the same rate as the current thirteen private 29 non-profit community mental health centers, as referenced in SECTION 8, 30 APPROPRIATIONS - COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS; SECTION 10, ALLOCATION 31 RESTRICTIONS; SECTION 11, ALLOCATION RESTRICTION AND TRANSFER PROVISION; and 32 SECTION 13, APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. 33 SECTION 18. A medical doctor can be paid at any rate within the range 34 35 specified in Section 1 herein.

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SECTION 19. VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Mental Health 2 3 Services of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized under the 4 1991-93 biennium to provide employment opportunities for some of the working 5 residents who are separate from the currently authorized regular vocational 6 trainee positions. The positions authorized herein shall not be incorporated 7 into the present classification system but shall be provided for by each 8 Community Mental Health Center, or State Hospital, on a cash account basis. 9 It is the intent of the General Assembly that the authorization of these 10 positions shall facilitate the Agency's ability to provide for residents who 11 are not part of a regular vocational training program. 12 SECTION 20. APPROPRIATIONS - RESEARCH AND TRAINING INSTITUTE. 13 14 hereby appropriated, to the Department of Human Services - Division of Mental 15 Health Services, to be payable from the Mental Health Services Fund Account, 16 for the establishment and operation of an Institute for the study and 17 treatment of psychiatric disorders and for training of mental health 18 professionals for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the sum of . . . 20 21 SECTION 21. The Research and Training Institute is authorized to seek, 22 accept, and administer public or private funds, consisting of donations, 23 Federal and State grants, aids, contracts, reimbursements, cash donations or 24 State general revenue to accomplish its purposes. The Institute is intended 25 to: (1) Promote recruitment and retention of highly qualified professionals 26 27 at programs operated or certified by the Division of Mental Health Services, 28 Community Mental Health Center programs and other public sector mental health

- 29 programs in Arkansas;
 30 (2) Improve clini
- 30 (2) Improve clinical care by exploring new, innovative, and 31 scientifically-based treatment models for adults with serious mental illness
- 32 and children and adolescents with serious emotional disturbance;
- 33 (3) Provide expanded clinical research and clinical-based research
 34 training opportunities for existing staff in institutional and community-based

35 programs operated, certified, or supported by the Division of Mental Health

1 Services; and

2 (4) Promote the understanding of the various interdisciplinary 3 treatments and the challenges facing institutional and community-based mental

4 health professionals in Arkansas.

5 To accomplish these purposes, the Institute may enter into joint
6 operating agreements with state universities or other institutions of higher
7 education to accomplish the placement and training of students and faculty in
8 psychiatry, psychology, social work, occupational therapy, nursing, and other
9 relevant professions; design, support, and implement clinical research
10 projects to improve the quality and effectiveness of mental health services
11 and operations; enter into agreements with Community Mental Health Centers and
12 other public mental health providers to accomplish the exchange of
13 professional staff between state-operated programs and Community Mental Health
14 Centers; and establish a student loan program in accordance with procedures
15 established by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, when the Director of the
16 Division of Mental Health Services has determined a shortage of such
17 professionals exists.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the
Institute may enter into agreements with the Division of Mental Health
Services which may involve changes in staffing necessary to implement improved
patient care programs contemplated by this section, and may enter into
agreements with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, Department of
Psychiatry to jointly operate or to support specific undertakings that are
congruent with the Institute's stated purposes.

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SECTION 22. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 2 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 3 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which 4 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 5 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 6 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 7 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 8 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 9 SECTION 24. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and 10 11 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and 12 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 13 14 SECTION 25. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the 15 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 16 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which 17 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 18 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable. 19 20 SECTION 26. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict 21 with this Act are hereby repealed. 22 SECTION 27. HEALTH PREMIUMS. The Department of Human Services -2.3 24 Division of Mental Health Services shall not, during the 1992-93 fiscal year, 25 spend more for health insurance per employee than the amount being contributed 26 to the State Employees Health Insurance Program. 27 28 SECTION 28. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the 29 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of 30 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year 31 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the 32 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, 33 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the 34 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm 35 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental

1 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
2 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
3 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
