## **SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 COMMENDING MRS. MAGALEN O. BRYANT FOR HER COMMITMENT TO  
8 THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A UNIFIED LAND USE PROGRAM WHEREBY  
9 ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE LANDS CAN BE PRESERVED WITHOUT  
10 SERIOUSLY DIMINISHING THE ECONOMIC PRODUCTIVITY OF SUCH  
11 LANDS.

14 WHEREAS, the people of the state of Arkansas are increasingly realizing  
15 that environmental consciousness must go hand in hand with economic  
16 development; and

17 WHEREAS, the wise, productive, and reverent use of land is an  
18 indispensable part of sound economic and environmental policy; and

19 WHEREAS, Mrs. Magalen O. Bryant, a distinguished citizen of our  
20 neighboring state of Mississippi, well known to many Arkansans, is by her life  
21 and example showing the way towards a unified land-use approach combining both  
22 economic productivity and environmental sensitivity; and

23 WHEREAS, Mrs. Bryant owns and manages extensive farm properties and  
24 wetlands in Mississippi and Louisiana, including the beautiful farm and  
25 wildlife refuge known as Tara on the Mississippi River; has donated thousands  
26 of acres and much time and treasure to promote the protection of valuable  
27 natural resources; pioneered the use of donated perpetual easements as an  
28 environmental-management tool; led the creation of the Delta Environmental  
29 Land Trust Association, known as DELTA, as a vehicle for the receipt and  
30 management of these easements; and is devoting her life to action, education,  
31 and persuasion in support of this cause,

33 NOW THEREFORE,

34 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE  
35 STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

2       That the Arkansas General Assembly hereby heartily commends Mrs. Magalen  
3 O. Bryant as an exemplar of the fundamental truth that action by private  
4 citizens in their individual capacities is essential to the realization of any  
5 sound public policy, and that government of whatever level, important though  
6 it is, can never do the whole job -- an exemplar whom we hold up to our fellow  
7 citizens of Arkansas as worthy of praise and imitation.

9 signed, attested, and sealed, shall be presented to Mrs. Magalen O. Bryant as  
10 a sign of our respect, admiration and affection.
