HOUSE BILL 1920

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE SOUTH ARKANSAS COMMUNITY
10 COLLEGE FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1995; AND
11 FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE SOUTH ARKANSAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
15 APPROPRIATION."

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for South
20 Arkansas Community College for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum
21 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
22 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
23 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
24 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
25 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
26 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
27 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
28 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
29 successor.

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5 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for South
6 Arkansas Community College for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum
7 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
8 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one hundred seventy
9 five (175) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not
10 to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act,
11 or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

13 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to South
14 Arkansas Community College, to be payable from the South Arkansas Community
15 ~~College Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of South Arkansas~~
16 Community College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1995, the following:

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33 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
34 to the South Arkansas Community College, to be payable from cash funds as
35 defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the South Arkansas Community College, for

1 personal services and operating expenses of the South Arkansas Community
2 College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1995, the following:

24 SECTION 5. PRIORITIES. A high priority of South Arkansas Community
25 College shall be the combatting of illiteracy and the providing of industrial
26 training, in the work place.

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28 SECTION 6. The appropriation level provided in Section 3 of this Act
29 shall not be construed as a commitment of the Arkansas General Assembly to
30 provide a particular level of support from the Work Force 2000 Development
31 Fund for the South Arkansas Community College but rather that the funds to be
32 made available are to be based upon legitimate criteria and accreditation
33 requirements as determined by the State Board of Higher Education for all
34 technical colleges.

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1 SECTION 7. HOUSING ALLOWANCE. Upon approval by the South Arkansas
2 Community College Board of Trustees, the President of South Arkansas Community
3 College may receive a housing allowance in an amount not to exceed four-
4 hundred dollars (\$400) per month in lieu of college housing.

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6 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
7 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
8 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
9 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions
12 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
13 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
14 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
15 disbursement of said funds.

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17 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
19 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
20 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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26 SECTION 10. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
27 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
28 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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30 SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
31 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
32 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
33 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
34 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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1 SECTION 12. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
2 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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4 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
5 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
6 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
7 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1993 is essential to the operation of
8 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
9 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
10 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1993 could work irreparable harm upon the
11 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
12 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
13 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
14 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.
