**HOUSE BILL**

## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 6-42-108 TO IDENTIFY THE  
9 SUMMER RESIDENTIAL AND DAY PROGRAMS AS THE \_PRESIDENT  
10 CLINTON SCHOOL FOR EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT\_; AND FOR OTHER  
11 PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

14 "IDENTIFY SUMMER RESIDENTIAL AND DAY PROGRAMS AS THE  
15 \_PRESIDENT CLINTON SCHOOL FOR EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT\_"

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-42-108 is amended to read as follows:

20 "§ 6-42-108. Summer residential and day programs.

21 (a) The Department of Education is authorized to establish annual  
22 summer residential and day programs to provide enriched educational offerings  
23 for junior high and high school students who have demonstrated exceptional  
24 abilities in a specific subject area.

25 (b) Each program shall offer instruction in subject areas to be  
26 designated annually by the Department of Education from the subject areas of  
27 science, mathematics, computer science, social studies, arts and music,  
28 literature and communication, and foreign languages.

29 (c) The summer educational programs established pursuant to the  
30 authority of this section shall be operated by the Department of Education  
31 directly or by contract with other public or private agencies and shall be  
32 funded from the appropriation to the Department of Education for the operation  
33 of programs for the education of gifted and talented students.

34 (d) The programs established pursuant to this section shall be named  
35 the \_President Clinton School for Exceptional Achievement\_."

SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
