20 WHEREAS, the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act of 1974 (CAPTA)
21 permits states to provide that spiritual treatment for children in lieu of
22 medical treatment shall not in and of itself be considered child maltreatment;

25 WHEREAS, most states, including Arkansas, have statutes providing that
26 spiritual treatment for children in lieu of medical treatment shall not in and
27 of itself be considered child maltreatment; and

29 WHEREAS, until recently the Administration for Children and Families of
30 HHS has approved states_ provisions regarding spiritual treatment for
31 children, but recently has disapproved said provisions; and

33 WHEREAS, CAPTA is due for reauthorization in 1994;
