For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE
9 TREASURER OF STATE FOR PAYMENT TO VARIOUS MUNICIPALITIES
10 TO CORRECT ERRORS MADE BY THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF THE CENSUS
11 FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR
12 OTHER PURPOSES."

14 "AN ACT TO PAY ALL CITIES DUE TO CENSUS ERRORS."

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS-GENERAL REVENUE. There is hereby
20 appropriated, to the Office of the Treasurer of State, to be payable from
21 general revenues accruing to the Municipal Aid Fund, to correct errors made by
22 the Federal Bureau of the Census in the 1990 federal decennial census which
23 resulted in the underpayment of general revenues to the municipalities listed
24 below, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

1 appropriated, to the Office of the Treasurer of State, to be payable from

16 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
17 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
18 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
19 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
22 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
23 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
24 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

26 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
27 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
28 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
29 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
30 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
31 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
32 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
33 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

35 SECTION 5. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent

1 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
2 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

4 SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
5 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
6 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
7 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
8 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

9

10 SECTION 7. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
11 with this Act are hereby repealed.

12

13 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
14 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that errors in the 1990 federal decennial
15 census resulted in a loss of revenues to the municipalities enumerated in this
16 Act, and that the underpayment of city turnback funds to these municipalities
17 should be corrected immediately in order for them to operate in the most
18 efficient manner. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and
19 this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
20 health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage
21 and approval.
