# A Bill

**SENATE BILL 260**

## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE AUDITOR OF STATE FOR THE  
10 BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1995; AND FOR OTHER  
11 PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE AUDITOR OF STATE APPROPRIATION."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

18 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
19 Auditor of State for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum number of  
20 regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the  
21 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et  
22 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,  
23 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein  
24 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification  
25 and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are  
26 hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and  
27 Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

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31 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Auditor  
32 of State for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time  
33 or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds  
34 appropriated herein for such purposes: fifteen (15) temporary or part-time  
35 employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the

1 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for  
2 the appropriate classification.

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4 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Auditor  
5 of State, to be payable from the State Central Services Fund, for personal  
6 services and operating expenses of the Auditor of State for the biennial  
7 ~~period ending June 30, 1995, the following:~~

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23 SECTION 4. It is the intent of the 79th General Assembly that the  
24 authorization of seven additional Circuit & Chancery Judge positions created  
25 in response to the United States District Court Order in the case of Eugene  
26 Hunt, et al v. State of Arkansas, et al be discontinued as the terms of the  
27 displaced incumbent judges expire pursuant to the court order.

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29 SECTION 5. *Effective July 1, 1994:*

30 (A) *The disbursing officer of each agency, board, commission,*  
31 *department or institution shall be responsible for reviewing all invoices*  
32 *prepared by commercial printers or suppliers holding commercial contracts to*  
33 *make certain that the charges to the agency, board, commission, department or*  
34 *institution are proper under the terms of the contract;*

35 (B) *The Office of State Purchasing of the Department of Finance and*

1 Administration shall maintain complete files, which shall be open to public  
2 inspection, on all commercial term and one-time contracts. The files shall  
3 contain:

4 (i) A copy of the contract;

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6 (ii) A list of all printing or duplicating done or commodities ordered,  
7 as well as the name of the invoiced agency;

8 (iii) A copy of all correspondence regarding the contract or jobs  
9 performed thereunder; and

10 (iv) A listing of the warrant number and amount of each warrant issued  
11 in payment of each job performed or commodity delivered.

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13 SECTION 6. Effective July 1, 1994, Arkansas Code §19-11-101, §25-18-  
14 302, §25-18-303, §25-18-304 are hereby repealed.

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16 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
17 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
18 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
19 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and  
20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control  
22 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the  
23 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
24 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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27 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
28 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
29 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which  
30 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
31 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
32 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
33 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
34 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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1 SECTION 9. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent  
2 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas  
3 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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5 SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the  
6 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
7 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
8 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
9 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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11 SECTION 11. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
12 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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14 SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
15 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas  
16 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that  
17 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1993 is essential to the operation of  
18 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
19 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
20 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1993 could work irreparable harm upon the  
21 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
22 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
23 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
24 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.
