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16 WHEREAS, the Arkansas General Assembly must depend upon useful and  
17 accurate financial health care data and other statistics to conduct the  
18 state\_s business and protect the health of its citizens; and

19 WHEREAS, the people of Arkansas greatly depend upon effective and cost  
20 efficient delivery of health care services; and

21 WHEREAS, the state\_s economy and its attractiveness to investors depends  
22 upon the good health of its citizens; and

23 WHEREAS, public and private health care expenditures are of growing  
24 concern to us all; and

25 WHEREAS, there is a history of confusion and disagreement in regard to  
26 the accuracy of health care financial data and other statistics; and

27 WHEREAS, there is no mechanism for formal review or challenge of  
28 presentations of health care financial data and other statistics other than by  
29 the General Assembly or courts of law; and

30 WHEREAS, consensus on health care financial data and other statistics is  
31 essential to effect meaningful public health policy,

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33 NOW THEREFORE,

34 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE

1 STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

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3       The General Assembly hereby urges state agencies and health care  
4 providers to agree on financial and statistical statements of fact before they  
5 are communicated to the General Assembly and to compile such information using  
6 generally accepted methods and techniques after consultation with all affected  
7 professional health care provider organizations.

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
