14 FOUNDATION NATIONAL EDUCATOR AWARDS.

16 WHEREAS, the six Arkansas educators listed below have been signally
17 recognized by the Milken Family Foundation as outstanding educators:

18 Brenda Sivils Ball is an English, literature and writing teacher at Pine
19 Bluff High School in the Pine Bluff School District, a teacher for twenty-one
20 years who is known for her enthusiasm for both teaching and learning, is
21 recognized as an outstanding professional across the state, is very active in
22 several professional organizations, and was chosen as the 1992 Arkansas
23 Teacher of the Year;

24 Linda Childers is principal of Thurman G. Smith Elementary School in the
25 Springdale School District, and her leadership abilities, coupled with her
26 enthusiasm and ability to motivate, have resulted in her school receiving
27 numerous awards, including the Excellence in Education Award from the U.S.
28 Department of Education and the Arkansas Elementary School Award of
29 Excellence;

30 S. Irving Granderson is a seventh-grade science teacher at Elmwood
31 Junior High School in the Rogers School District. His inspiring and
32 innovative "hands-on" approach to teaching science led to Mr. Granderson being
33 selected as a Presidential Award Winner in Math and Science by the national
34 Science Foundation in 1989. He has had several articles published and has
35 received numerous grant awards;

36 Yoriko "Lola" Perritt is a science specialist at Carver Math/Science

1 Magnet School in the Little Rock School District. Described by her colleagues
2 as "bubbly" and "excited about teaching and learning", Ms. Perritt's
3 enthusiasm is contagious to both students and her teachers. Recognized
4 statewide as an outstanding teacher by her peers, Ms. Perritt is a 1990
5 recipient of the Presidential Award for Science;

6 David Rainey is principal of Dumas High School. Recognized as an
7 effective administrator and leader, Mr. Rainey constantly works with his staff
8 on curriculum and assessment improvements. He serves as a positive influence
9 not only in his school, but in his community as well. Very active in several
10 professional organizations, Mr. Rainey currently serves as president of the
11 Arkansas Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development;

12 Lynn Smith is an art teacher at Northside High School in the Fort Smith
13 School District. His innovative teaching techniques, coupled with his
14 enthusiasm, have garnered Mr. Smith several state and national awards. He was
15 most recently selected as the 1992 Arkansas Art Educator of the Year.

16 WHEREAS, these dedicated educators inspire their students, make learning
17 come alive and demand excellence and high expectations in their schools and
18 classrooms; and

19 WHEREAS, the persons listed above are most deserving of public
20 commendations and congratulations for their outstanding contribution to public
21 education in Arkansas and for being selected as 1992 recipients of the Milken
22 Family Foundation National Educator Awards,
