## For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO REPEAL THE WOMEN' S COMM SSI ON. "

## Subtitle

"AN ACT TO REPEAL THE WDMEN' S COMM SSI ON. "

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTI ON 1. Arkansas Code 20-84-101 is hereby repeal ed.
20-84-101. Legistative findings.
The General Assenbly finds and declares that:
(1) Arkansas women ranked forty-ninth (49th) and fiftieth (50th)
in the nation in areas of poverty and education, respectively, in a study of homen's economic and employment status. An important role for state government is to address the betterment of Arkansas women, and thus, the state as a Whole. The Gener al Assenbly believes that useful and innovative measures can be devel oped to raise the educational and economic stat us of women.
(2) Therefore, it is the intent of the General Assenbly to create the Arkansas Women's Comm ssion, which shall serve as a focal group for initiating policy affecting the advancement of women in education and economics.

SECTI ON 2. Arkansas Code 20-84-102 is hereby repeal ed.
20-84-102. Creation. Menbership. Rei noursement. Meetings.
(a) There is created the Arkansas Wbmen's Comm ssion which shall consist of eleven (11) femle memers appointed as follons:
(A) There shall be four (4) members of the comm ssion
appointed by the Governor and each menber shall be fromone of this state's four (4) congressional districts.
(B) The Governor shall appoint the four (4) members equally among the two maj political parties in this state.
(2) There shall be one (1) menber appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.
(3) There shall be two (2) legistative menbers of the comission. One (1) member shall be a member of the Senate and one (1) member shall be a menber of the House of Represent atives. They shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, respectively.
(4) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Attorney

## General.

(5) There shall be one (1) menber appointed by the Secret ary of

## State.

(6) There shall be one (1) rember appointed by the State

## Ireasurer.

(7) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Chi ef Justice of the Arkansas Supreme-Court.
(b) Menbers shall be appointed for three-year staggered term, to be assigned by lot. The terms shall commence on J anuary 15 of each year. For the first two years, terms of four (4) members shall expire on January 14 beginning January 14, 1999. On the third year, tern of three (3) menbers shall expire on January 14.
(c) The commission shall annually select by majority vote one (1) of its members to serve as a chairperson and one (1) to serve as vice chairperson.
(d) In the event of a vacancy on the commission in one of the nonlegistat ive positions for any reason ot her than expiration of a regul-ar term the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by appoint ment of the designated of ficer in subdivision (a) (3)-(7) of a person meeting the same qualifications required for initial appoint ment.
(e) Menbers of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation for their services but may receive expense rei mbursement and a stipend not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50) per meeting in accordance with- $\$ 25-16$-901 et seq. (f) The legislative members ma, to the extent funds are available,
feceive, in lieu of reimbursement for meals, lodging and travel, the same per diem and $\mathbf{m}$ l eage allowance for each day of attending meetings of the comission as is authorized by law for attending meetings of the interim committees of the General Assembly.
(g) The comm-ssion shall hold its first meeting during January, 1998-at a place designated by the Governor. Subsequent meetings will be hel d quarterly or at the call of the chairperson.

SECTI ON 3. Arkansas Code 20-84-103 is her eby repeal ed.
20-84-103. Functions, powers, and duties.
The Arkansas Women's Comission shall have the following functions, powers, and duties:
(1) To study and coordinate efforts to further education and the economic advancement of women;
(2) To assist the Governor and the General Assembly in forming state policies and long-range plans for woren's education and economic advancement and in answering needs related thereto;
(3) To anal yze and make recommendations concerning proposed Legislation or programs that my affect women's education and economic advancement;
(4) To apply for and receive grants or financial assistance from the federal government or other agencies, individuals or corporations;
(5) To promote and encourage the establishment of a nonprof it center, and to cooperate and coordinate with and assist the center in acquiring state and feder al government and private nonprof it and corporate foundation grant funds to aid in women's education and economic advancement;
(6) The comission shall prepare and submit to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House bienni-ally, on January 1 of each odd numbered year, a comprehensive report concerning the activities undertaken by the commission, recommendations for legislative proposals, data concerning women's education and economic advancement and ot her pertinent information on activities conducted by the comission in the previous biennium ot her copies will be available on request.
