35	(a) There is created the Arkansas Women's Commission which shall consist of eleven (11) female members appointed as follows:

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appointed by the Governor and each member shall be from one of this state's 1 2 four (4) congressional districts. 3 (B) The Governor shall appoint the four (4) members equally among the two major political parties in this state. 4 5 (2) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Lieutenant 6 Governor. 7 (3) There shall be two (2) legislative members of the commission. One (1) member shall be a member of the Senate and one (1) member shall be a 8 member of the House of Representatives. They shall be appointed by and serve 9 at the pleasure of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of 10 the House, respectively. 11 12 (4) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Attorney 13 General. (5) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Secretary of 14 15 State. (6) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the State 16 17 Treasurer. 18 (7) There shall be one (1) member appointed by the Chief Justice 19 of the Arkansas Supreme Court. 20 (b) Members shall be appointed for three-year staggered terms, to be assigned by Lot. The terms shall commence on January 15 of each year. For the 21 22 first two years, terms of four (4) members shall expire on January 14 beginning January 14, 1999. On the third year, terms of three (3) members 23 24 shall expire on January 14. 25 (c) The commission shall annually select by majority vote one (1) of its members to serve as a chairperson and one (1) to serve as vice 26 27 chai rperson. (d) In the event of a vacancy on the commission in one of the 28 29 nonlegislative positions for any reason other than expiration of a regular term, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by 30 31 appointment of the designated officer in subdivision (a)(3)-(7) of a person meeting the same qualifications required for initial appointment. 32 (e) Members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation for 33 their services but may receive expense reimbursement and a stipend not to 34

exceed fifty dollars (\$50) per meeting in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seg.

(f) The legislative members may, to the extent funds are available,

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1	receive, in lieu of reimbursement for meals, lodging and travel, the same per		
2	diem and mileage allowance for each day of attending meetings of the		
3	commission as is authorized by law for attending meetings of the interim		
4	committees of the General Assembly.		
5	(g) The commission shall hold its first meeting during January, 1998 at		
6	a place designated by the Governor. Subsequent meetings will be held quarterly		
7	or at the call of the chairperson.		
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9	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 20-84-103 is hereby repealed.		
10	20-84-103. Functions, powers, and duties.		
11	The Arkansas Women's Commission shall have the following functions, powers,		
12	and duties:		
13	(1) To study and coordinate efforts to further education and the		
14	economic advancement of women;		
15	(2) To assist the Governor and the General Assembly in forming		
16	state policies and long-range plans for women's education and economic		
17	advancement and in answering needs related thereto;		
18	(3) To analyze and make recommendations concerning proposed		
19	legislation or programs that may affect women's education and economic		
20	advancement;		
21	(4) To apply for and receive grants or financial assistance from		
22	the federal government or other agencies, individuals or corporations;		
23	(5) To promote and encourage the establishment of a nonprofit		
24	center, and to cooperate and coordinate with and assist the center in		
25	acquiring state and federal government and private nonprofit and corporate		
26	foundation grant funds to aid in women's education and economic advancement;		
27	(6) The commission shall prepare and submit to the President Pro		
28	Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House biennially, on January 1 of		
29	each odd numbered year, a comprehensive report concerning the activities		
30	undertaken by the commission, recommendations for legislative proposals, data		
31	concerning women's education and economic advancement and other pertinent		
32	information on activities conducted by the commission in the previous
