### Subtitle

16 "AN ACT CONCERNING GUN SAFETY EDUCATION  
17 IN SCHOOLS. "

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
21

22 SECTION 1. A public school district may incorporate gun safety  
23 education programs into their curriculum. A public school may, by cooperating  
24 with other entities use existing programs, such as the programs sponsored by  
25 the National Rifle Association and the programs sponsored by the Arkansas Game  
26 and Fish Commission.  
27

28 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
29 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
30 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.  
31

32 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
33 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
34 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
35 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
36 act are declared to be severable.
