6	WHEREAS, 1998 ending stocks of U. S. long grain rice increased by 40%;

9	WHEREAS, U. S. rice stocks are foreseen to increase even further in
10	1999, given that current conditions for U.S. agriculture remain unchanged;

13	WHEREAS, U. S. farmers believe their work is to produce food for the
14	world and that food is not a weapon; and

16	WHEREAS, the sale of Arkansas rice to the Republic of Cuba will pose no
