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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:			
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 22-3-220 is amended to read as follows:			
21	22-3-220. Smoking in State Capitol Building prohibited.			
22	Any person smoking any cigarette, cigar, pipe, or other tobacco product			
23	in the rotunda of the State Capitol Building or in the Governor's Conference			
24	Room, the Old Supreme Court Room, or the cafeteria in the State Capitol			
25	Building shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of twenty-five			
26	dollars (\$25.00).

28	SECTION 2. EME	RGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found an	<u>nd determined by the</u>	
29	Eighty-second General	Assembly that second-hand smoke is a	<u>a detriment to the</u>	
30	health of people who work in and visit the State Capitol Building as well as			
31	damaging to the building, its displays, and other contents; that this act will			
32	prohibit smoking in the State Capitol Building; and that this act should			
33	become effective as soon as possible in order to protect the health of people			
34	who work in and visit the State Capitol Building. Therefore, an emergency is			
35	declared to exist and	this act being immediately necessary	<u>y for the</u>	
36	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on			



1	the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor
2	vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the
3	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
4	vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective
5	on the date the last house overrides the veto.
