Arkansas Code 20-22-708 is amended to read as follows: Possession, sale, and use unlawful - Exceptions. 24 20-22-708. 25 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, sell, or use, 26 within the State of Arkansas, or ship into the State of Arkansas, except as 27 provided in § 20-22-711, any pyrotechnics, commonly known as fireworks, other than the permissible items enumerated in this section, except as provided in 28 29 this subchapter. The permissible fireworks consist of those defined in Interstate Commerce Commission regulations described as Class C fireworks 30 31 only and shall include the following: (1) Roman candles, with no handle or spike affixed thereto, not 32 33 exceeding ten (10) balls spaced uniformly in the tube, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed twenty grams (20 g.) each in weight. The inside 34 tube diameter shall not exceed three-eighths inch (3/8"); 35 36 (2) Sky rockets, with sticks, total pyrotechnic composition not

- 1 to exceed twenty grams (20 g.) each in weight. The inside tube diameter shall
- 2 not exceed one-halfinch (1/2"). The rocket sticks must be securely fastened
- 3 to the tubes. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the following is not a
- 4 permissible item: a skyrocket with a casing of less than three-eighths of an
- 5 <u>inch (3/8") for the outside diameter and less than two and one-fourth inches</u>
- 6 (2 ¼") in length and with an overall length, including stick, of less than
- 7 twelve inches (12"), customarily known as "bottle rockets";

- 8 (3) Helicopter-type rockets, total pyrotechnic composition not 9 to exceed twenty grams (20 g.) each in weight. The inside tube diameter shall 10 not exceed one-half inch (1/2");
- 11 (4) Cylindrical fountains, total pyrotechnic composition not to 12 exceed seventy-five grams (75 g.) each in weight. The inside tube diameter 13 shall not exceed three-fourths inch (3/4");
  - (5) Cone fountains, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed fifty (50) grams fifty grams (50 g.) each in weight;
  - (6) Wheels, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed sixty grams (60 g.) for each driver unit or two hundred forty grams (240 g.) for each complete wheel. The inside tube diameter of driver units shall not exceed one-half inch (1/2");
  - (7) Illuminating torches and colored fire in any form, except items included in subdivision (a)(12) of this section, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed one hundred grams (100 g.) in weight;
  - (8) Sparklers and dipped sticks, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed one hundred grams (100 g.) each in weight. Pyrotechnic composition containing any chlorate or perchlorate shall not exceed five grams (5 g.);
  - (9) Mines and shells of which the mortar is an integral part, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed forty grams (40 g.) each in weight;

  31 dimensions of which do not exceed one and one-half inches (1 1/2") in length
  32 or one-quarter inch (1/4") in diameter, and other items designed to produce
  33 an audible effect, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed two (2) grams

- 35 (11) Novelties consisting of two (2) or more devices enumerated 36 in this paragraph, trick matches, and cigarette plugs, when approved by the

4	(b) No component of any device listed in this section which is
5	designed to produce an audible effect shall contain pyrotechnic composition
6	in excess of <del>two (2) grams</del> <u>two grams (2 g.)</u> in weight excluding propelling or
7	expelling charges.
8	(c) On and after midnight, January 5, 2002, the possession, sale, and
9	use of the common fireworks devices customarily known as "bottle rockets",
10	and as described herein, shall be unlawful within the State of Arkansas.
11	Provided, however, the possession or sale of bottle rockets by a
12	manufacturer, importer, distributor, or jobber wholesaler to a person outside
13	the State of Arkansas for the purpose of resale outside the state shall not
14	be considered as possession or sale occurring within the State of Arkansas.
15	Any person violating the provisions of this subsection shall be guilty of a
16	Class C misdemeanor.
