2	SECTION 2. No State agency, board, commission, office or institution
3	shall expend more funds from the same state treasury fund, state treasury
4	fund account as was expended in the previous fiscal year with the exception
5	<u>of:</u>
6	(1) Public School Fund expenditures for elementary and secondary
7	education as appropriated by law;
8	(2) Department of Correction expenditures required for the care and
9	custody of state inmates as appropriated by law;
10	(3) Expenditures required for the continuation or expansion of the
11	Medicaid program as appropriated by law;
12	(4) Expenditures mandated by the federal government required for

14	(5) Expenditures mandated by a state or federal court; or

17	SECTION 3. No state agency, board, commission, office or institution
18	shall grant a cost of living increase to any employee whose annual salary
19	rate is in excess of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000). However, at the end of
20	the fiscal year a bonus may be granted to an employee whose annual salary
21	rate is in excess of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in an amount equal to
22	or less than the cost of living increase authorized for all other employees.
23	The bonus shall be payable only from the savings in the budgeted
24	appropriation of the state agency, board, commission, office or institution
25	for the year as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. The
