Private school eligibility. 24 To be eligible to participate in the Ability Scholarships for Students 25 with Disabilities Program, a private school may be sectarian or nonsectarian, 26 and must: 27 (1)(A) Demonstrate fiscal soundness by being in operation for one (1) 28 school year or provide the Department of Education with a statement by a certified public accountant confirming that the private school desiring to 29 30 participate is insured and the owner or owners have sufficient capital or credit to operate the school for the upcoming year serving the number of 31 32 students anticipated with expected revenues from tuition and other sources 33 that may be reasonably expected. 34 (B) In lieu of the statement, a surety bond or letter of credit 35 for the amount equal to the scholarship funds for any quarter may be filed 36 with the department;

12	(a) The maximum scholarship granted for an eligible student with
13	disabilities is a calculated amount equivalent to the per-student share of
14	the minimum state and local revenue per average daily membership, plus the
15	student's share of any additional funding received by the district for
16	providing services to students with disabilities.
17	(b)(1) The amount of the Ability Scholarship is the calculated amount
18	or the amount of the private school's tuition and fees, whichever is less.
19	(2) The amount of any assessment fee required by the
20	participating private school may be paid from the total amount of the
21	scholarship.
22	(c)(l) If the participating private school requires partial payment of
23	tuition before the start of the academic year to reserve space for students
24	admitted to the school, that partial payment may be paid by the Department of
25	Education before the first quarterly payment of the year in which the Ability
26	Scholarship is awarded, up to a maximum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), and
27	deducted from subsequent scholarship payments.
28	(2) If a student decides not to attend the participating private
29	school, the partial reservation payment must be returned to the Department of

35	(a) The State Board of Education may adopt rules to administer this

1	(b) However, the inclusion of eligible private schools within options
2	available to public school students does not expand the regulatory authority
3	of the state, its officers, or any school district to impose any additional
4	regulation of private schools beyond those reasonably necessary to enforce
5	requirements expressly stated in this subchapter.
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
