17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 7, Subchapter 2 is amended
20 to add an additional section to read as follows:

21 8-7-227. Methamphetamine laboratory cleanup.

22 (a) Methamphetamine, its salts, and precursors and ephedrine,
23 pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine, and their salts, optical isomers,
24 and salts of optical isomers, alone or in a mixture shall be treated as
25 hazardous materials.

26 (b) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may employ any of
27 its powers under the Arkansas Hazardous Waste Management Act of 1979 to
28 enter, investigate and clean up any property used in the manufacture of
29 methamphetamine.

30 (c) The first three thousand dollars (\$3,000) of any fine levied
31 against a person who is found guilty of or who pleads guilty or nolo
32 contendere to manufacture of methamphetamine, § 5-64-401(a)(1)(i), or
33 possession of drug paraphernalia with the intent to manufacture
34 methamphetamine, § 5-64-403(c)(5), shall be deposited in the Emergency
35 Response Fund as provided by § 8-7-410 to be used for cleanup of
36 laboratories, sites, or substances used in the manufacture of



1 methamphetamine.
