26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - CYBER COLLEGE ADDITIONAL SUPPORT. There is
29 hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, to be
30 payable from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, for providing
31 additional support for the College of Information Sciences and Systems
32 Engineering (Cyber College) of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock
33 which shall be supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in
34 Section 3 of Act 234 of 2001, the following:

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7 SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
9 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal
10 Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State
11 Treasurer the sum of three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$3,200,000)
12 from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the University of Arkansas
13 at Little Rock Fund to provide funds for the appropriation provided herein.

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15 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
16 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
17 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
18 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
19 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
20 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
21 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
22 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
23 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
24 with in disbursement of said funds.

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26 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
27 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
28 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
29 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
30 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
32 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
33 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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35 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
36 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of

1 the University of Arkansas at Little Rock are, due to unforeseen
2 circumstances, insufficient for the University of Arkansas at Little Rock to
3 continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of
4 this act will provide the necessary monies for the University of Arkansas at
5 Little Rock to continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date
6 of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and
7 provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is
8 hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force
10 and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

11 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
12 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
13 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
15 the veto.

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
