Arkansas Code § 24-4-301(a)(2)(C)(i) and (ii), concerning 28 membership in the Arkansas Public Employees Retirement as condition to 29 employment, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows: 30 (C)(i) A person who is first elected as a member of the General Assembly on or after July 1, 1999, shall have his or her employment covered 31 32 as a regular state employee member in lieu of coverage under special 33 provisions relating to General Assembly members or to elected officials. 34 However, if the member's only service under an Arkansas retirement plan is service as a member of the General Assembly, then the member must have ten 35 36 (10) five (5) or more years of actual service to be eligible for benefits.

11	for disability retirement benefits under the Arkansas Public Employees		
12	Retirement System, is amended to read as follows:		
13	(a)(1)(A) Except for members of the General Assembly who need at least		
14	ten (10) years of actual service, any Any active member with five (5) or more		
15	years of actual service, including actual service for at least eighteen (18)		
16	of the twenty-four (24) calendar months immediately preceding his or her		
17	disability, who becomes totally and permanently physically or mentally		
18	incapacitated for any suitable job or position as an employee as a result of		
19	a personal injury or disease may be retired by the Board of Trustees of the		
20	Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System upon written application filed		
21	with the board by or on behalf of the member.		
22			
23	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-4-521(b)(4)(A), concerning credited		
24	service under the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System, is amended to		
25	read as follows:		
26	(4)(A) Noncontributory employment as a member of the General Assembly		
27	shall be credited at the regular rate for crediting service, except that at		
28	least $\frac{10}{10}$ five (5) years of actual service shall be required to meet the		
29	retirement eligibility requirements of §§ 24-4-510, 24-4-511, and 24-4-609,		
30	and at least five (5) years of actual service shall be required to meet the		
31	eligibility requirements of § 24-4-608.
