10 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT TREATING HORSES WITH BEHAVIOR
11 ALTERING SUBSTANCES WITHIN TWENTY-FOUR (24) HOURS

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 5, Chapter 37, Subchapter 5 is amended
23 to add an additional section to read as follows:

24 5-37-504. Horses - Behavior alteration before sale.

25 (a) It is unlawful for any person to sell any horse that has, within
26 the previous twenty-four (24) hours, been treated in any manner with a
27 behavior altering substance.

28 (b)(1) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a buyer may
29 rescind the sale of a horse and receive full repayment of any moneys paid if
30 the horse has been treated with a behavior altering substance within twenty-
31 four (24) hours of the sale.

32 (2) However, if the expiration of the twenty-four (24) hours
33 falls on a weekend or holiday, the right to rescind shall extend through the
34 next business day following the weekend or holiday.

35 (c) Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be a Class A
36 misdemeanor.

(d)(1) This section shall not apply to any horse claimed in a claiming race at a licensed racetrack under the jurisdiction of the Arkansas Racing Commission if the treatment otherwise subject to this section consists only of medications which may be administered to the horse without violating any applicable rule of the commission.
