28	SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized				
29	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds				
30	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the

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2 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 3 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 4 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this acc 5 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 6 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 8 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 9 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 10 11 <u>SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General</u> 12 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 13 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 14 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 15 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that i 16 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 17 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 18 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 19 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
