## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO PROVIDE MUNICIPAL POLICEMEN AND FIRE FIGHTERS WHO HAVE TEN (10) OR MORE YEARS OF SERVICE AT THE MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENT WITH TWENTY (20) DAYS OF ANNUAL VACATION WITH FULL PAY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

TO PROVIDE CITY POLICEMEN AND FIRE FIGHTERS WHO HAVE TEN (10) OR MORE YEARS OF SERVICE IN THE CITY DEPARTMENT WITH TWENTY (20) DAYS OF PAID VACATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 14-52-106 is amended to read as follows:
14-52-106. Annual vacation.
The head or chief of each police department shall arrange that each employee, who has:
(1) Less than ten (10) years of service in the police department, shall be granted an annual vacation of not less than fifteen (15) working days with full pay; and
(2) Ten (10) or more years of service in the police department, shall be granted an annual vacation of not less than twenty (20) working days with full pay.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 14-53-107 is amended to read as follows:
